Election Officials Will Be at Polls Also on Nov. 1; List Polling Places

The first registration day for Lake county voters who expect to cast their ballots in the general election on November 8 is October 18, and those who fail to visit the polling places on that date will have another opportunity on November 1, the last day for registering in this county.

Election officials will be at each polling place in the several townships on October 18 to give information to voters and see that they are properly registered. They will be at the polling places again on November 1.

Anyone who has removed to another precinct since should be sure to see that his or her name is listed in the poll list of the precinct in which their new address is. Also, it is pointed out by election officials, is a safe precaution for everybody to make sure that his or her name is on the list in the precinct in which he or she lives.

Those who did not vote in the April primary should not fail to visit the polling places in their respective precincts on October 18 to make sure that they are registered. If you are not registered it may be necessary to swear in your vote on election day, it is explained.
