

DEERFIELD SHIELDS BEATEN BY SUBURBAN LEAGUE CHAMP'S 19-7

OAK PK. ATTACK STRONG Play Well Under Heavy Loss of Regulars

After holding Oak Park, last year's Suburban league champions, for the first quarter, Deerfield wilted under the strong aerial attack which Oak Park produced in the second quarter of the first league game at the high school field, last Saturday.

Punts Feature First Quarter

Deerfield won the toss and kicked to Oak Park. Petersen kicked to Andersen, who returned the ball fourteen yards to the 39-yard line. After a few plays failed, Zinkil kicked to the 12-yard line, where Allen received it and ran out of

bounds to the 20-yard line. Allen then punted badly and the ball went out of bounds on the 21-yard line as the quarter ended 0-0.

The third play in the second quarter was a pass, Andersen to Zinkil for a touchdown, but the play was called back and Oak Park received a five-yard penalty for offsides. Another pass, Andersen to Hoffman, was good for another touchdown, but that play was also called back and Deerfield was giving the ball on downs.

Play sea-sawed back and forth until Axton dropped back to punt. The kick was slightly blocked, Oak Park recovering. On the next two plays Burling made a first down. A pass, Andersen to Oakes, made it another first down with the ball on the 6-yard line. On the next play Burling went over for a touchdown. Belzer place kicked the extra point.

After an exchange of punts Oak Park was again put in a scoring

position on the 21-yard line. Andersen made five yards off tackle to the 16-yard line, and on the next play Burling went through the center of the line for his second touchdown. Belzer's attempted place kick was blocked by Swan.

In the third quarter no large amount of ground-gaining was done. Burling and Andersen carried the bulk of offense for Oak Park. Very little running was done by Deerfield, most of the plays being punts.

A few minutes after the fourth quarter had opened a pass, Andersen to Pierce, netted a touchdown. The point after touchdown was blocked by Swan, making the score 19-0.

Play continued with both teams playing evenly until an exchange of punts put Deerfield on the 43-yard line. A pass, Allen to Petersen, netted thirty-seven yards. A penalty of fifteen yards set Deerfield back, but a pass, Allen to Irving, made

it a first down. Another pass, Allen to Wicklander, netted a touchdown.

Nothing was done in the remaining minutes of play.

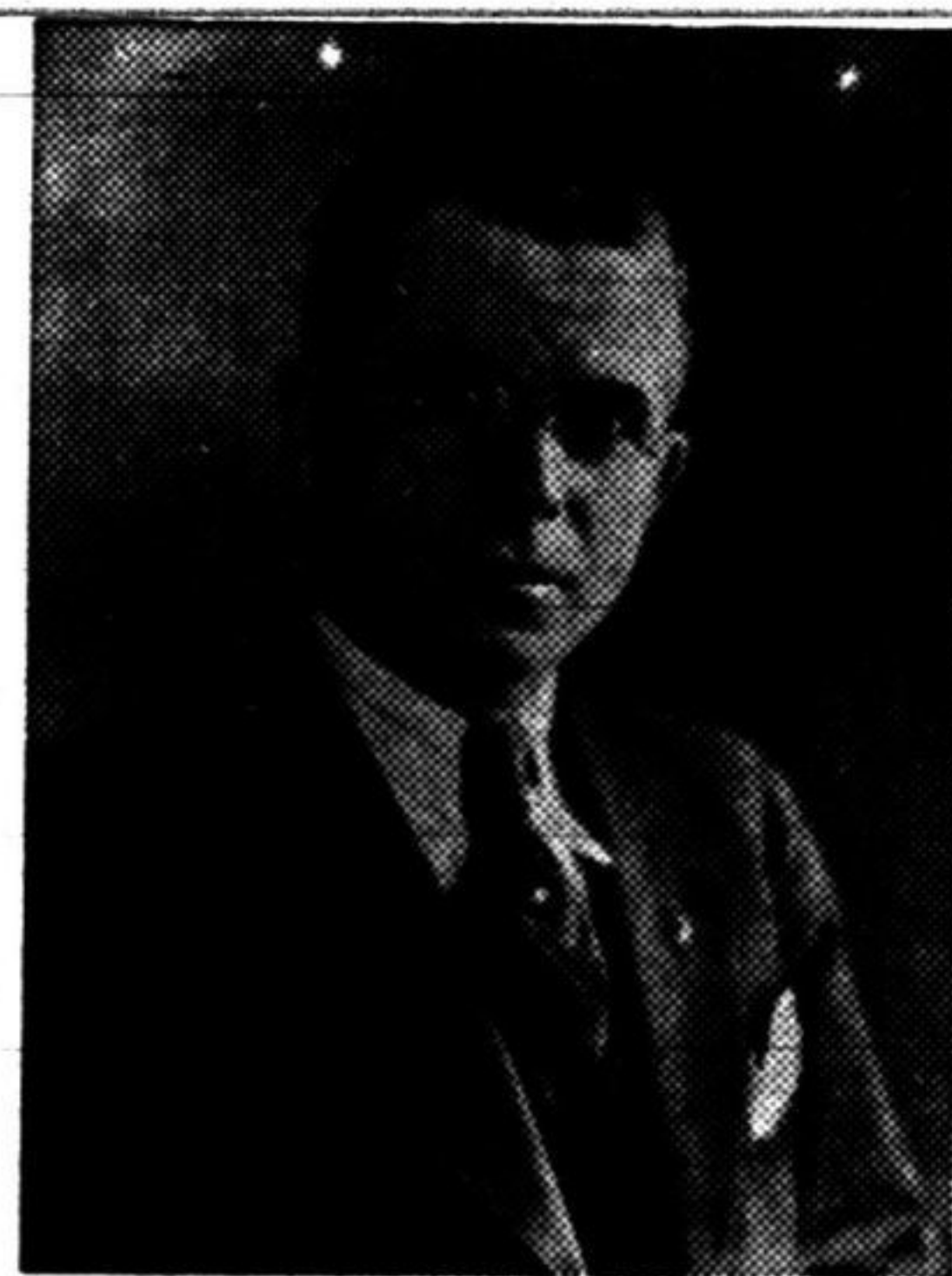
