**GOOD ENROLLMENT IN
LEADERSHIP SCHOOL**

**Opening Session Held Tuesday
Night at Highland Park
Presbyterian Church**

The opening session of the fourth annual Leadership Training school under the auspices of the Deerfield-Shields Council of Religious Education was held in the Highland Park Presbyterian church on Tuesday evening. A most interested and enthusiastic group met for this session which is indicative of a larger enrollment during the coming week.

Thus far eight churches along the north shore are represented in the school and their representation is as follows: Glencoe Union church, Glencoe, 8; Deerfield Presbyterian church, Deerfield, 6; Bethlehem Evangelical church, Deerfield, 2; St. Paul's Evangelical church, Deerfield, 1; St. John's Evangelical church, Highland Park, 6; Bethany Evangelical church, Highland Park, 4; Presbyterian church, Highland Park, 14; and Highwood Methodist church, Highwood, 4. Last year there were representatives from the Methodist and Union churches of Lake Bluff, from the Presbyterian and Methodist churches of Lake Forest, and from the Evangelical and Presbyterian churches of Northbrook and it is hoped these churches will have members enrolling next week.

Registration

The registration fee is nominal and persons may register at the next session, October 18, at 7:30, and receive credit toward a diploma of Christian Leadership granted by their denominations and the International Council of Religious Education. There has always been a large percentage of the school doing credit work toward such a diploma.

Three courses are offered: "The Study of the Old Testament" is taught by Prof. Allen Albert of Western Theological seminary, Evanston. Prof. Albert gave a most geographical significance of the introduction of the historical and Jewish people and their relation to the religious development of these people. "The Teaching Work of the church" is taught by Dr. R. H. Elliott, director of religious education for Chicago Presbytery, Chicago. This course is especially fine for superintendents, officers, pastors, and those interested in the general educational program of the church. His group was very interested in his presentation of the subject matter. "Primary Materials and Methods" is taught by Mrs. Shelby T. Dexter, a specialist in children's work and superintendent of the primary department in the Highland Park Presbyterian church. Mrs. Dexter's approach to her class was most helpful and all those interested in the religious education of children will find this course especially helpful.

Mrs. Dexter will present the subject matter in such a way that those connected with the Beginners and Junior department in the Sunday school will be benefitted by it. Mothers are urged to come into this class, for it will help to clear up some of the religious problems
