Amateur Bicycle Road Race of 35 Miles to Start at Libertyville

The annual grind of the Amateur Bicycle League of America and the Chicago Division will this year be held from Libertyville to Chicago, and a committee headed by Emil Denmark, Frank M. Kalteux, Edw. A. Mahlke and Otis J. T. Taylor have announced that the race will be held on October 23rd, starting at Libertyville at 1 p.m. and the course will follow Milwaukee avenue to Harlem avenue, Harlem avenue to Madison street and Madison street to Crawford avenue, a distance of thirty-five miles.

About two hundred riders will compete in the grind and the first thirty riders will receive a prize, which will include many valuable merchandise awards.

All the star riders in and around Chicago will compete and from the list of entries coming in and the comments being made on the race it is expected that the greatest number of entries ever received will be had for this race and a possible new record will be made for the thirty-five miles.

State Representative Richard Lyons and Charles C. Hoskins of Mundelein and Libertyville are the directors of the race at Libertyville and have made arrangements for the care of the riders and the start of the race.

Carl Stockholm, internationally known bicycle rider, will be the referee of the race and will be assisted by Henry Vertenten of the Belgian American Cycle club of Chicago.

Oscar Hendrickson Is Found Dead Last Week in Room in Hotel Here

Oscar Hendrickson, 41, a handy man around Highland Park homes for the past several years, last Wednesday was found dead in a bathtub overflowing with water in the Stewart hotel, St. John's and Central avenues, in the Highland Park business section.

The man's body was discovered completely submerged in the water by Officer Harry Rogan, of the Highland Park police, who was summoned by the hotel desk clerk shortly before 11 o'clock to force an entrance into the room when some anxiety was felt for Hendrickson's safety.

According to reports from Highland Park police, the man was seen to enter the hotel at 9 o'clock Wednesday morning and was apparently under the influence of liquor. He had no definite residence and it was believed that he had taken the Stewart hotel room to recover from a drinking spree that he was reported to have started a few days before.

A doctor summoned to the place pronounced Hendrickson dead and reported that it was possible he may have suffered a heart attack. An inquest was held Thursday and a coroner's jury returned a verdict of death by being scalded.
