**Deerfield to Meet Strong Wild-kit Attack; Power Is Evident**

When Deerfield-Shields invades Beardsly field to meet the Evanston Wildkits next Friday, football enthusiasts are going to see a combination of swift running and power versus a well balanced aerial bombardment. Coach Vance has a well built machine with every cog set to see that the Wildkits record isn't marred.

So far this season the Evanstonians have succeeded in disappointing all invaders who have any thought of scoring in mind. Deerfield, although not winning any contests, has a record for hard fought and skillfully played games. The remarkable showing against Oak Park more than proves that Deerfield is in tip top shape to meet the Wildkits.

The Wildkits are just as powerful this year as they have been in previous years. Coach Vance has a forward wall that would be envied by many college coaches. From end to end the line spells strength, especially at the ends. Dawson and Walworth are the strong wingmen who have already been considered for possible selection on the All-suburban team. Nadjowski has been looked on as probable starter in place of Walworth. Tackles who will combat with Deerfield linemen are Sidall, Erandi, and Lowe. The

guards who will see action are Meigo and Wakefield. Whiteside will oppose Swan in a battle for honors.

**Possess Strong Backfield**

The Evanstonians boast a backfield of stars and whirlwind ball carriers. Outstanding among these is Champion, whose powerful body has been responsible for most of the Wildkits' points so far. Haines is by no means new to fans at Deerfield. Haines will be seen at left half, with Franks, his running partner, on the right. Franks has been out with a cracked rib and saw action for the first time this season last Saturday. Martin will be seen at quarterback. Woods will also see action in the game against the Blue and White. Woods is known for his broken field running. Many others who have not been mentioned will see possible play.

Coach Thurston has a spunky line. Petersen and Irving will give the Wildkits trouble that is trouble. With an aggregation of tackles and guards averaging from 179 to 198 pounds, Deerfield will attempt some pile driving. Mundstock, Oldenburg, Yore, Ghini, Connelly, and Rutledge will be among those linemen to see action. As usual "Rip" Swan, the colorful Deerfield center, will see plenty of football. There are several others who have been working out in practice that will be ready for the game.

The backfield will be about the same as the one that faced Oak Park last week. Allen Axton will be at full, Johnston and Wicklander at halves, and Jack Allen at quarter. Many others will be on their toes for the first call. Ullman, Schwartz, Cummings, P. Allens,

"Red" McCarthy, and Glader are all eligible substitutes.

**Hope for Victory**

Deerfield hopes to repeat the victory of 1929 when the Wildkits lost 33-12. This can only be done when a team plays until the whistle ends the game, and when every player gives every ounce of strength he has. This is what "Solly's" squad did against Oak Park and what they hope to do against the Evanstonians Saturday.

With Evanston so close to home there is no reason why a large number of students can't plan on going. The support given the team when they encountered Oak Park is what they'll need when they invade the Wildkits camp. It may be made possible for the band to go as well as the cheerleaders. As many as can go or plan to go will meet in front of the school auditorium to follow the parade onward to Evanston and perhaps—victory.
