First of Indoor

On Saturday, October 5, the first of the Indoor Playdays sponsored by the Y.W.C.A. for children between the ages of six and fourteen will be held at the Y.W.C.A. These Playdays are a continuation of the Outdoor Playdays which have been held during the month of October in Sunset park, and will be conducted along the same lines and directed by practically the same group of instructors, but will be at the Y.W.C.A. This building is a more than adequate place for these programs, having two large playrooms for games and dancing and a space for outdoor play.

The morning will be devoted to swimming at the high school pool. However, the Y.W. is working in co-operation with the Highland Park library, and those children who do not go swimming will have Story Hour at the library from 10:30 to. 11:30. After picnic luncheon at the Y, the afternoon will be given over to interest groups in organized play and group athletics, handcraft, dramatics, and tap-dancing or interpretative dancing.

Closing get-together, from 3 to 4 o'clock will be a time for singing, presentation of play, treasure hunts, marshmallow roasts, and coasting, if the weather permits.

The group of children attending these playdays will, of necessity, be a small one, since the purpose is to give a well supervised program of constructive recreation. For this reason children must register at the Y.W.C.A. by Friday, October 4 There is a small charge for the twelve weeks course which will cover cost of instruction and will include one hot dish which the "Y" will furnish each noon.
