#### Chicago Man Is Shot While Duck Hunting; Accidental Discharge

Robert Rokos, 23 years old, 2234 S. Clifton ave., Chicago, was seriously wounded while duck hunting last week on Fox Lake when his companion's gun discharged accidentally.

The full effect of the charge from the 16-guage shotgun lodged in Rokos' left shoulder and Dr. Charles Lieber, county physician, considers the patient's condition extremely critcal.

Rokos went hunting with Carl Bernanek of 3602 W. 72nd st., Chicago.

Dr. Lieber learned that the two were in the boat alone at the time of the shooting. He understood that the gun, which was across the seat of the boat, was moved sufficiently to discharge it.

Deputy Sheriff Jack Froelich was dispatched to Fox Lake by Sheriff Lester Tiffany to investigate the shooting.

Froelich stated that the waves were across the channel and that waves splashed in on the guns. Beranek reached for the weapons to wipe the water away, and the 16guage discharged, he said.
