Charles Weber Speaks at Democratic Rally

Charles H. Weber, Democratic candidate for Congress in the Tenth district answered statements of James Simpson, Jr. one of his Republican opponents in talks at Highwood Tuesday night and at Elm Place auditorium last night.

Mr. Weber, who is an ex-service man, has charged that supporters of Mr. Simpson have either consciously or accidentally sought to convey the impression that he is a veteran although he did not serve in any branch of the service.

The Democratic candidate emphasized that his advocacy of prohibition repeal is motivated by conviction that legalized sale of beer and wine would give state, local, and federal governments a means to control the liquor traffic and to collect revenue urgently needed to defray government expenses during the depression.

He also challenged Mr. Simpson to state the nature of his affiliation with Bill Thompson and Len Small in an advertisement contained in this week's issue of the Press.
