**Ravinia Forum To  
 Start Series of  
 Discussions Soon**

announces that another of its series of community discussions on public affairs will be held on next Saturday evening, Dec. 3, at 8:15 in the upper hall of the Ravinia Village house. The committee has decided to hold at least five more monthly meetings during the winter, in which the liberal viewpoint in political and educational matters of general public interest will be emphasized. All the meetings will be open to men and women of Ravinia and Highland Park and their invited guests.

Next Saturday evening there will be two speakers. Fred A. Moore, director of the Adult Educational Council of Chicago and leader of the Chicago Forum, will come to Ravinia to speak on the theme: "What Can a Forum Do for a Community?" He will be followed by S. A. Mathiasen, formerly head of the Pocono People's College, Pocono, Penn., and now head of the American Peoples college in Austria. His subject will be "Dynamic Education in a World Crisis."

Mr. Mathiasen, who is to appear on Dec. 4 at the Chicago Forum in a loop theatre, as the second speaker in the Forum's series on "A New Social Philosophy," will give the same address in Ravinia on the evening before.

Of Danish extraction, he is a competent interpreter of the remarkable folk-schools and peoples colleges which have done so much to lift Denmark to its present enviable position among the very healthy, most literate, co-operative and civilized nations of the world. He has recently returned from Europe where he aided in establishing the "American Peoples college," at the town of Oetz, in the Austrian Tyrol, which has become an active center for the study and interpretation of the

newer educational, social and political movements seeking to overcome the destructive political nationalisms and narrow economic policies that have brought most of the peoples of Europe and the world to their present unhappy condition. Mr. Mathiasen will describe the kind of education, which, in the opinion of the peoples colleges, offers the only hope of finding a way forward to a new era of international co-operation.

**Lake County Dental  
 Group To Meet Here**

The December meeting of the Lake County Dental society will be held at the Green Tea Pot in Highland Park the evening of Monday, Dec. 5, at 6:30. Dr. Earl Fritch is in charge of arrangements.

The guest clinician will be Dr. Wm. E. Harper, of Chicago. His subject will be "Silver Alloys." Dr. Harper is one of the oldest workers in this field, and his lecture will be accompanied by a demonstration. He will be the overnight guest of Dr. Hugo Fisher, of Highland Park.

In 1851 and 1852 the construction of a plank road from the old town of Port Clinton, located on the lake shore east of where the Moraine hotel now stands, to Half Day, was started. The lumber used for this unsuccessful attempt was cut at a saw mill located on the beach at Port Clinton.

The town of Port Clinton, a predecessor of Highland Park, was started about 1850 a little south of the older town of St. Johns. A pier and steam saw mill on the beach were the first industries. A logging chute was built down the bluff to the mill, and later a road-way was constructed down the bluff. This was passable for ox teams.
