Northwestern Will Play Marquette on Next Saturday Night

Marquette university's basketball team, which last year proved quite a stumbling block for Big Ten, will oppose Northwestern at Patten gymnasium at Evanston Saturday night in the second game of the season for the Wildcats. Northwestern opened its schedule Monday night with a 44 to 19 win over Bradley.

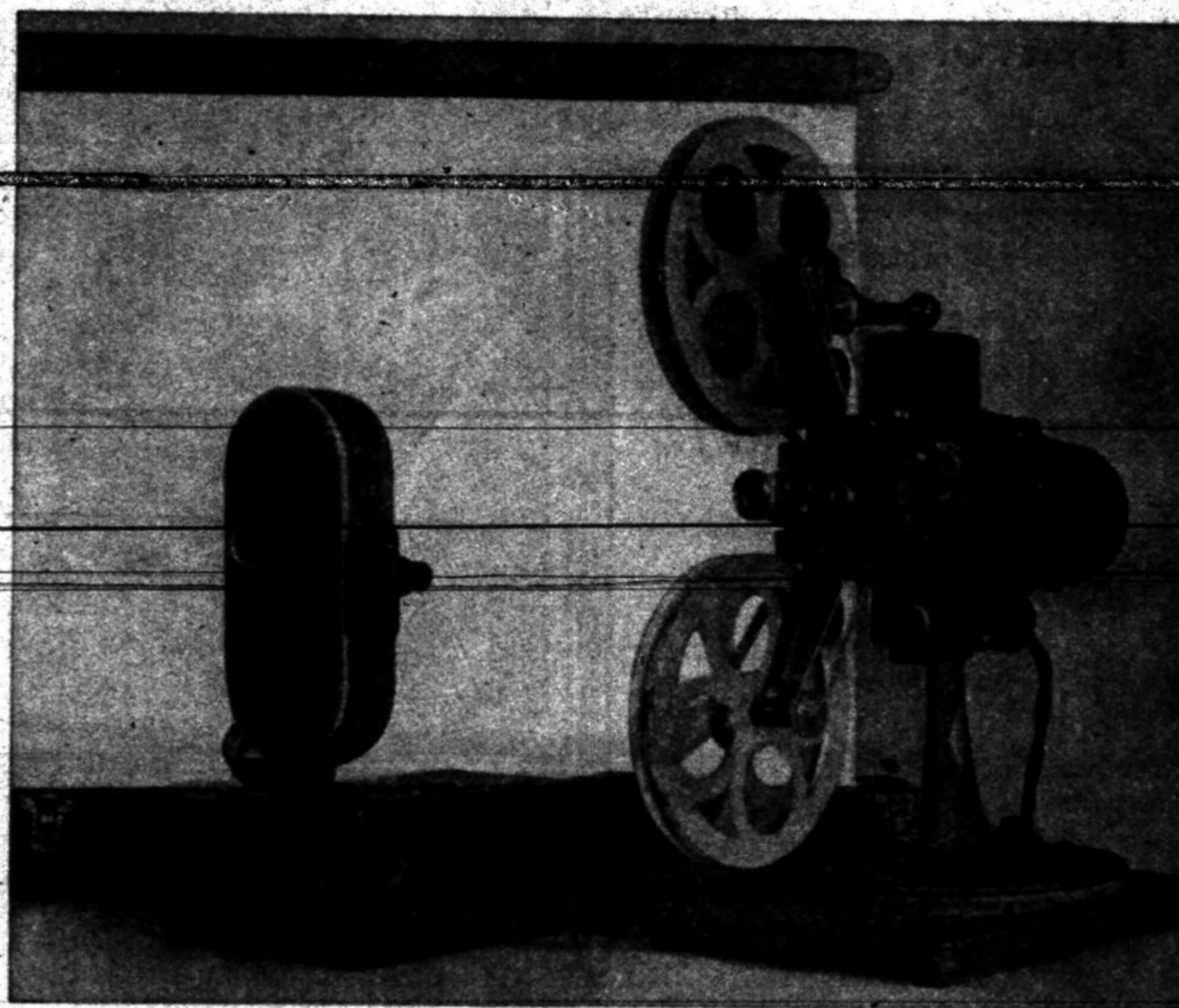
In addition to sporting a veteran aggregation of stars, the Marquette players have the "World's fastest waterboy," for none other than Ralph Metcalf, Olympic sprint star, will administer to the wants of the visitors during the "timeouts."

Four of the players in Marquette's starting lineup were members of last year's quintet. Heading the list is Eugene Ronzani of Iron Mountain, Mich., fullback and captain of last fall's football team. Ronzani is 6 feet tall and weighs 200 pounds. He and Francis Zummach are the co-captains of the cage squad and both play guard.

Zummach, incidentally, is the only starter who is not six feet tall. He is 5 feet 8 inches. Ray Morstadt of Waukegan, sophomore forward is 6 feet. The other forward, Ed Mullen, is 6 feet 2 inches, and Ernest Kukla, the center, is 6 feet 3 inches. William Mangan, sophomore center candidate from Lane Tech, Chicago, is 6 feet 6 inches tall.

The Bradley game indicated that Northwestern will require several more games before it will be possible to determine a first string quintet. No less than half a dozen guard aspirants showed that they must be given consideration. All performed pretty much on a par. They included Culver and Moonshower, the starters against Bradley, and Perry, Kawal, Kunkel, and Moeller, the substitutes.

Capt. Joe Reiff, forward, and Elmer Johnson, center, indicate that they will be the mainsprings in the attack. Their seasoned floor work did much to weld the Wildcats into a smooth working combination. Don Brewer apparently has cinched the other forward position. Against Bradley he dropped in four field goals.
