

RUSH OF CHRISTMAS MAIL IS ANTICIPATED

Parcels to Different Parts of U. S. Should Be Sent Early

"Shop and Mail Early" is the slogan of the Highland Park post-office again this year as it prepares to handle the rush of holiday mail which must be delivered on or before Dec. 24.

Christmas day is on Sunday this year, and there will be no deliveries on that day or the following day, Monday, Dec. 26.

In order to insure all parcels being delivered on rural routes and by carriers throughout the United States, parcels must reach the Highland Park postoffice earlier than usual this year, in order that they may reach the office of destination on or before Dec. 24. The latest dates for mailing parcels for delivery in the United States before Christmas, are listed at the end of this article.

For 1/2 Cent Each

Printed Christmas and other greeting cards in unsealed envelopes may bear a simple written inscription not in the nature of personal correspondence, such as "Sincerely yours," "Merry Christmas," "Happy New Year," "With best wishes," etc., together with the name and address of the sender and of the addressee, without subjecting them to more than the third-class rate, which is 1 1/2 cent each.

Greeting cards, sealed or unsealed, bearing written messages other than the simple inscription above mentioned, as well as all cards in sealed envelopes, are chargeable with 3-cent postage.

In preparing and mailing parcels, patrons of the postoffice are asked to follow these instructions: Do not write the address of the sender and addressee on more than one side of the parcel. Greetings, the name of sender and addressee, but no other writing, may be put inside the parcel.

"Buy Stamps Here"

"Mail all your parcels and cards at Highland Park to insure prompt delivery, and be sure to buy all your stamps here," requests the postmaster.

Here are the latest dates for mailing parcels for delivery in various parts of the United States:

Pacific coast states, Dec. 15 to 17. (Washington, Oregon, California, and Nevada.)

Western states, Dec. 16 to 19. (Montana, Wyoming, Utah.)

Southern states, Dec. 16 to 19. (Arizona, New Mexico, Oklahoma, and Texas.)

Near western states, Dec. 17 to 20. (North Dakota, South Dakota, Nebraska, Kansas, Colorado.)

Southern states, Dec. 17 to 20. (Arkansas, Louisiana, Tennessee, Mississippi, Alabama, Florida, Virginia, West Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia.)

Neighboring states, Dec. 19 to 21. (Minnesota, Iowa, Missouri, Michigan, Indiana, Ohio, Kentucky.)

Eastern states, Dec. 17 to 20. (New York, Pennsylvania, Maryland, New Jersey, Delaware and the New England states.)

Illinois, Dec. 21, 22.
