Mrs. McKenzie spent most of her life in Maplewood, N. J. The body was taken to Glen Spey, N. Y., where funeral services were held and interment made.

Mrs. Sasch was a devoted mother, sacrificing her own pleasures for her family. Her generosity and cheery disposition were an inspiration to those who were privileged to know her.
