The old saying "a good ittle team is as good as a good big team" proved all wrong last Friday night, for Lindblom and its six-footers played ring-around-the-rosie with our heavyweights and finally ended up on the long end of a 38-17 score.

Davis and Stankus led the Lindblom drive, scoring thirteen and fourteen points respectively, while McClure and Skidmore were outstanding on defense for Deerfield. McClure, stellar guard on the Deerfield quintet, saw that Lindbloms' score didn't get any bigger. Bob was a constant factor in getting the ball off the backboard and over the center line in less than ten seconds.

Lindblom Superior in Height

Lindblom's superiority in height proved a big help in their constant scoring. The two big men on the team, Stankus and Davis, both over six foot were responsible in keeping the Chicago team out in front. Stankus was a constant scorer all during the game.

Others on the team were also tall and helped in keeping Deerfield at the lower end of the score. Canwell, Slate, and Davis seemed outstanding, each performing their individual duties equally well.

With Johnston, McClure, and Paulsen in at regular positions, the Blue and White had a fairly fast starting combination, but before many minutes had gone by this combination was broken up because Johnston seemed to have an off night and was throwing the ball away too often.

Hansen, who had scored fifteen points in the University high game, was held to three slim points against this strong outfit. Hansen, who is only a sophomore, lacks height which is so necessary for a center. With the return of Hallberg next week, Coach Thurston can depend on Bill getting the tipoff against bigger fellows. Hansen is without a doubt one of the best heavies, and, with two years in which to develop, he should be a wonder.

Lindblom Opens With Score

In the latter part of the game Thompson was substituted for Swan at forward and showed himself capable of a regular position. With but a few minutes left, Thompson dribbled through the entire Lindblom team for a basket and a free throw.

Bob Skidmore played his usual improved game at guard, and, along with McClure, was one of the best guards on the floor. Bob's weight is an important factor under the basket and makes him a great pivot man.
