Pittsburgh Is Foe of Northwestern at Evanston Saturday

After breezing through its first two games with Bradley and Marquette, Northwestern's basketball team steps out into faster company Friday night when it meets the strong Pittsburgh team, for years one of the leading eastern quintets.

Pitt has invaded Patten gymnasium on three occasions in recent years, winning two games and losing one. Saturday night's encounter will give the Wildcats an opportunity of evening the count against the Panthers.

Judging from the showing made in its two appearances to date, Northwestern has the makings of another strong entry for the Big Ten race. The team has displayed more speed and versatility than those of the past two years, which is taking in considerable territory since the Purple won the Big Ten title in '31 and finished second last year.

Coach Dutch Lonborg has apparently decided on the makeup of his first string combination. The two regulars from last year, Capt. Joe Reiff, forward, and Elmer Johnson, center, are firmly entrenched in their positions. Three subs from last year, Don Brewer, forward, and Stan Culver and Marvin Moonshower, guards, complete the quintet.

This group averages slightly over 6 feet in height. Reiff is the tallest, being 6 feet 3 inches. Johnson is 6 feet 2 inches, while Brewer and Moonshower are both 6 feet. Culver is the midget of the outfit, being 5 feet 9 inches.

Dr. H. C. Carlson, veteran coach of the Pittsburgh team, has another of his typically fast breaking teams in the field this year. The speed and fine marksmanship of the Pitt players has placed them among the leading cage teams of the country in the past two years.

Pitt this year is captained by Don Smith, 6 feet 1 inch forward. He was an all-conference selection in the eastern league last year. Each member of the Panther first string lineup is 6 feet or over, placing them on a par with Northwestern in this respect.
