Police Radio Still Plan of Department, Civic Groups Here

The Highland Park police department, with the approval of practically all local civic organizations, would still like to install and use a community police radio broadcasting station, but lack of funds makes the plan impossible at the present time.

A temporary license for operating the proposed station was in effect until yesterday, and an application for removal was promptly made. The renewal is expected to be granted today.

The broadcasting equipment which it is proposed to use is owned by Rhea Johnson, Highland Park radio amateur, who has a commercial license.

Tests have been made of Mr. Johnson's equipment, and it has been proved satisfactory. It has an effective radius far greater than the boundaries of Highland Park, and if the plans work out, it might be possible to use this equipment as the basis of a shore-wide police radio hook-up.
