Community Bridge.
Club Planned for
Highland Park Now

A plan is now under way to form a bridge club in Highland Park similar to the Cavendish, the Knickerbocker and the New York Whist club. It is proposed to take over the old Highland Park club house as headquarters, which will provide all facilities for bridge games for twelve hours a day every day of the week. Memberships will be limited to 250, but each membership will include all the members of the immediate family.

In a talk with R. N. Ball, one of the active organizers of the plan, we are informed the activities will comprise:

Open house seven days a week from 11 a.m. until 1 a.m.

Men may drop in any evening and find seats at the open tables.

Men may play a set game at closed tables.

Women may arrange afternoon games for one table or entertain their club membership of several tables.

Women may have their own room for evening play.

Tournaments will be held once or twice each month for men only, and open to mixed pairs of four-somes.

Lessons will be given individually or in groups at very low club rates.

Club membership in the United States Bridge association will provide opportunity for the members of the club to play in any or all of the national tournaments.

Other features will be provided for the junior members in the way of a game room and the use of the dance floor and stage for theatricals.

Further outlining the features of this proposed new club, Mr. Ball stated: "it is felt this will provide every opportunity for every man and woman who enjoys a good game of contract or auction to test his or her skill against other good players; no longer will it be necessary to call up seven or eight friends before you can find three others free to play—you merely drop in at the club and there will always be a game. Your wife may meet and play with her friends afternoon or evening and with competitive experience will be able to play as your partner with no more friction. It will be satisfying to know your children are at the club in a nice environment. It will be an economical means of getting a great deal of entertainment and mental diversion. Membership for one year for the entire immediate family will be \$40.00, tax paid. If sufficient number of bridge players are interested we believe we can put this club in operation shortly after the first of the year."
