

### Change Wanted in County Government

Desirability of replacing the Lake County Board of Supervisors with the commission form of government is being seriously considered by the Waukegan Taxpayers' association and other civic groups.


Possibility that the issue may be submitted to the voters at the Spring election is seen this week when it was learned that petitions are being prepared for circulation.

Ray E. Thomas, Waukegan attorney, has spent the past several months in a detailed study of the legal requirements of the commission form, and has prepared a series of articles on its fundamentals, emphasizing the desirable features of the proposed change.

The county commissioner plan is now in effect in twenty-four counties in the state, outside of Cook county, which operates under a special charter. Taxpayers' groups are studying effects of the system in counties comparable in size to Lake.

Under the leadership of Mr. Thomas a "citizens committee" of ten leading Waukegan citizens is conducting a quiet educational campaign as the ground work for demanding the change. They will seek to impress upon the voters the fact that the board of supervisors, as now constituted, is an unwieldy and at the same time expensive form of administration.

### Clark Eichelberger to Address Ravinia Forum Next Monday

The third meeting of the Ravinia Community Forum will be addressed by Clark M. Eichelberger, of Chicago, on Monday evening, Jan. 2, 1933, in the upper hall of the Ravinia Village house, at 8:15 o'clock. Mr. Eichelberger, who is widely known as a student and lecturer on international affairs, and is director of the Mid-West Bureau of the League of Nations association, will speak on the subject. "The World Significance of the Manchurian Crisis, and Its Relation to Disarmament." Mr. Eichelberger is likewise to appear on the program, together with the French ambassador, it is anticipated, and several other prominent persons, at the forthcoming banquet in Chicago in commemoration of the ratification of the Pact of Paris for the Renunciation of War. His discussion of the aggressions of Japanese militarism in Manchuria, and of the efficacy of the world's peace-machinery in endeavoring to nullify it, in which the American State Department under Secretary Stimson has assumed the leadership, will, therefore, be of unusual interest and timeliness.

Residents of Ravinia and Highland Park, and their invited guests, are welcome to attend these forum meetings which are sustained by voluntary contributions and have been very successful in point of attendance.
