#### Change Wanted in County Government

Desirability of replacing the Lake County Board of Supervisors with the commission form of government is being seriously considered by the Waukegan Taxpayers' association and other civic groups.

Possibility that the issue may be submitted to the voters at the Spring election is seen this week when it was learned that petitions are being prepared for circulation.

Ray E. Thomas, Waukegan attorney, has spent the past several months in a detailed study of the legal requirements of the commission form, and has prepared a series of articles on its fundamentals, emphasizing the desirable features of the proposed change.

The county commissioner plan is now in effect in twenty-four counties in the state, outside of Cook county, which operates under a special charter. Taxpayers' groups are studying effects of the system in counties comparable in size to Lake.

Under the leadership of Mr. Thomas à "citizens committee" ten leading Waukegan citizens conducting a quiet educational campaign as the ground work for demanding the change. They will seek to impress upon the voters the fact that the board of supervisors, as now constituted, is an unwieldly and at the same time expensive form of administration.

The third meeting of the Ravinia Community Forum will be addressed by Clark M. Eichelberger, of Chicago, on Monday evening, Jan. 2, 1933, in the upper hall of the Ravinia Village house, at 8:15 o'clock,

Mr. Eichelberger, who is widely known as a student and lecturer on international affairs, and is director of the Mid-West Bureau of the League of Nations association, will speak on the subject. "The World Significance of the Manchurian Crisis, and Its Relation to Disarmament."
