Bridge Tournament to be Held Tonight

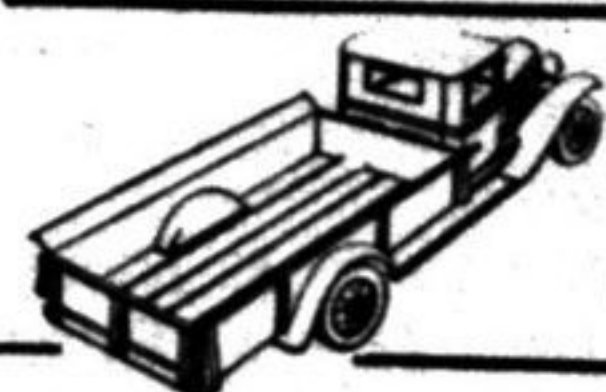
