Truancy Cases at Deerfield Ruled on by Judge J. Vetter

Test cases regarding "wilful truancy" from school were heard in Justice of the Peace John Vetter's court in Deerfield on Thursday afternoon and evening, Jan. 12, involving attendance of children from three families at Deerfield-Shields high school in Highland Park.

The defendants were Mrs. Mary Sherman, Mrs. K. K. Konsitzke, and Adolph Grubert, all of Deerfield. They are the parents of Viola Sherman, 14; Elizabeth Konsitzke, 15; and Florence Grubert, 14, who enrolled at the high school last September and have attended less than half the semester.

Personnel Officer and Visiting Teacher Mrs. Marie Ward Reichelt got the warrants on complaint of Principal R. L. Sandwick of the high school, and she appeared in court to give testimony.

Mrs. Konsitzke stated that her daughter did not attend school because of lack of proper clothing to wear. Mrs. Reichelt replied by saying that the Parent-Teacher Association and Social Service provide clothes where necessary to all students at Deerfield-Shields. She asserted that silk stockings and several pairs of shoes had been given the girl, but were being worn by the mother and an older sister. Lunch money can be earned by the students at the school.

Mrs. Sherman asked to have her daughter sent back to the Deerfield Grammar School, but the school board, because of crowded conditions, could not accept her.

Mr. Grubert pleaded the illness of his wife, and upon the presentation of a certificate from Dr. Sugden, Florence will be allowed to stay at home for several days.

Judge Vetter ruled that the three girls must be sent to school every day, otherwise the parents will be subject to fines of from \$5 to \$20 daily.
