

FORUM MEETINGS AT HIGH SCHOOL

Instructor at Lake Forest College to Conduct Series

A series of six open forum meetings at the Deerfield-Shields high school, all dealing with public economic problems and conducted by Ernest Engquist, of the faculty of Lake Forest college, will begin Monday, Feb. 20, and will be held on the five following Monday evenings. The meetings will begin each Monday evening at 8:15.

"The Economics of the Depression" will be the subject of the first meeting on Feb. 20, and the other subjects and dates are as follows: Feb. 27, "Inflation of the Currency"; March 6, "The Tariff and Industry"; March 13, "Rate Making in the Public Utilities"; March 20, "Problems of Transportation"; March 27, "The Problems of Price-Making and Results of Price Distortion."

Mr. Engquist, as instructor at Lake Forest college, has done graduate work in economics and political science at Northwestern university and the University of Illinois. He will give a prepared talk at the beginning of each meeting which will then be open to the oral problems of the time will furnish topics for discussion.

There will be no admission charge to the meetings, and course tickets are being given out at the following places: Pease's, McMahon's and Gsell's drug stores in Highland Park; Kraft's drug store in Lake Forest; Laegler's drug store in Highwood; Hout's drug store in Deerfield; and Gsell's drug store in Ravinia.

Northwestern U. Will Play Illinois Five Next

The University of Illinois, only conference team to defeat Northwestern University to date, will meet the Wildcats at Patten gym in Evanston Saturday night. The advance ticket sales indicate that another capacity crowd will witness the return engagement of the two teams.

A full house saw Illinois win a 27 to 25 verdict over the Purple at Urbana two weeks ago. The Illini have always been a stubborn foe for Northwestern and another hard-fought engagement is anticipated. Two years ago Illinois was the lone team to defeat Northwestern when the Wildcats captured the title with 11 victories and one loss.

Illinois mounted to its victory over Northwestern in the first game this season largely due to their ability to bottle up Joe Reiff, the Wildcats' scoring ace. In that game Joe was held to one field goal and four free throws, the lowest number of points he has ever scored during his three years of college competition.

Since the Illinois game the Wildcat captain has gone on to score a total of 60 points, giving him an average of 15 points per game. Against Chicago he scored 29 points tying the modern individual scoring record for one game. Don White of Purdue scored 29 points against Ohio in 1920.
