CUB PACK 55

Cub Pack 55, the first Cub Pack organized in Highland Park, dating back to Feb. 1921. Mr. R. W. Wilder was the original Cubmaster and led the group until this fall when Dr. C. V. Nichols has been supervising their activities.

CUB PACK 56

Cub Pack 56 is one of the most active in the Council. Under the leadership of Cubmaster Roy Fisher and assistant Cubmaster Joseph Redine, the Barnea Bible Class of the church sponsors this pack and is represented by the committee composed of: A. F. TROOP 36
