

Two "Purple Heart" Medals Awarded To Local Legionnaires

The regular meeting of Dumarcaq Spenser Post No. 145 of the American Legion was held at the Masonic Temple building Thursday evening, Feb. 16, when the local post entertained members of the Highwood and Deerfield posts.

A special program was prepared. Musical selections were rendered by Dave Suttle and H. A. Bridges, and vocal selections by J. S. Sproull.

Maj. Grover Sexton, commander of the seventh district, past commander of the Sheridan Post No. 165 and major of the 33rd Division, was the principal speaker of the evening.

At the conclusion of his remarks he presented Past Commander Henry A. Hansen and Enrico Piacenza the medal of the Purple Heart. Hans served with Co. B, 31st Infantry, 33rd Division, and was wounded in action during the Meuse-Argonne offensive on Oct. 10, 1918. Piacenza served with Co. H, 47th Infantry and was wounded at Bois de Foret on Oct. 12, 1918. This medal, "The Order of the Purple Heart," was originated by George Washington and was presented to all men of his army in recognition of their valor and for having received wounds in service. This custom has recently been revived during the bi-centennial celebration of the birth of George Washington and is being awarded to all ex-service men coming under this classification by the government.

At the close of the meeting Legionnaires Ledderboge and Arnsward entertained with a number of stunts in mesmerism. Art Swanson and his committee served the guests and members with a fried rabbit lunch. The post is anticipating another combined meeting soon.

Next Thursday evening, March 2, a short business meeting will be held in the Legion office beginning at 7:30 after which a public card and bunco party takes place in the meeting hall, third floor. All members, families and friends are cordially invited. No tickets are being sold but a small charge will be made at the door.

Plans are now under way for a joint meeting of the 8th district to be held in Highland Park on the evening of March 16. Details will be published at a later date.
