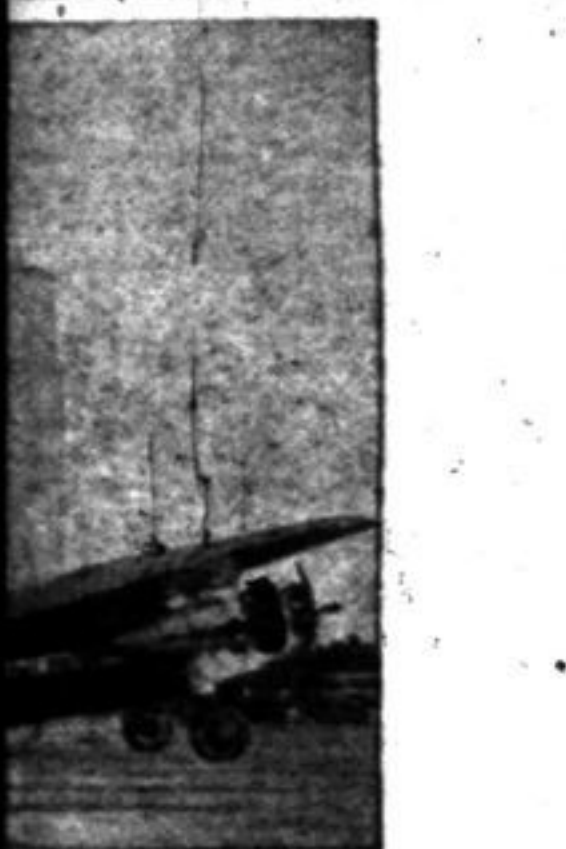


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DEERFIELD LOCAL and PERSONAL

Mrs. Roy M. Miller will entertain the Tuesday Evening Sewing Club next week.

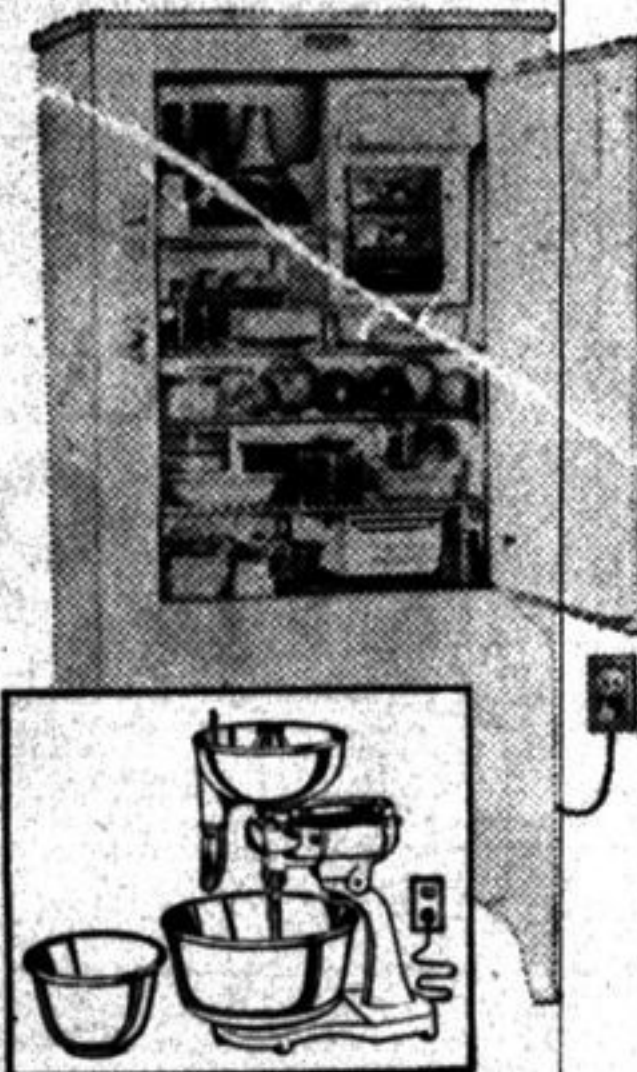
Mrs. Alex Willman entertained at quilting bees on Monday and Tuesday.

Miss Marjorie Schick entertained her bridge club Wednesday evening at her home in Northbrook.

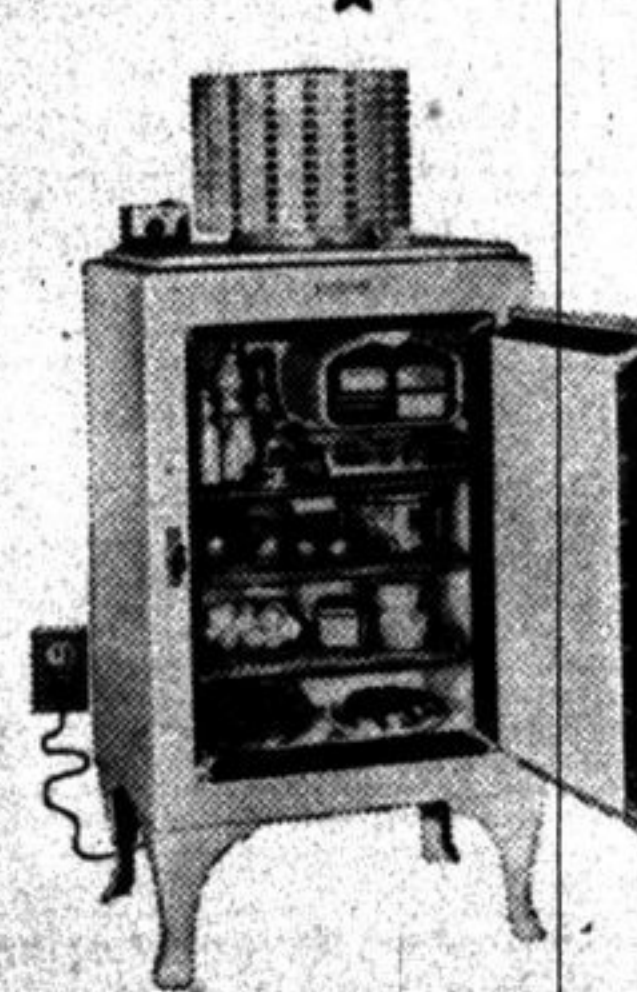

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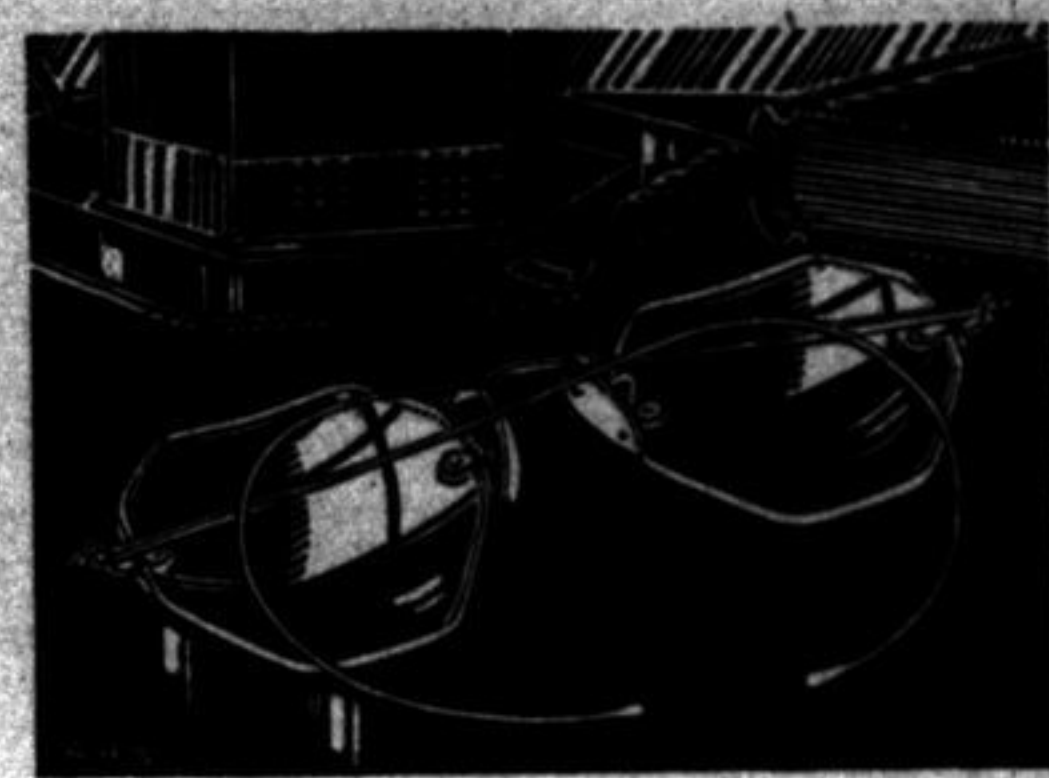
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
