The first time trials were held at New Trier in preparation for this meet. The only boys who showed up good were Bob Fox and Ray Anderson, running the 440.

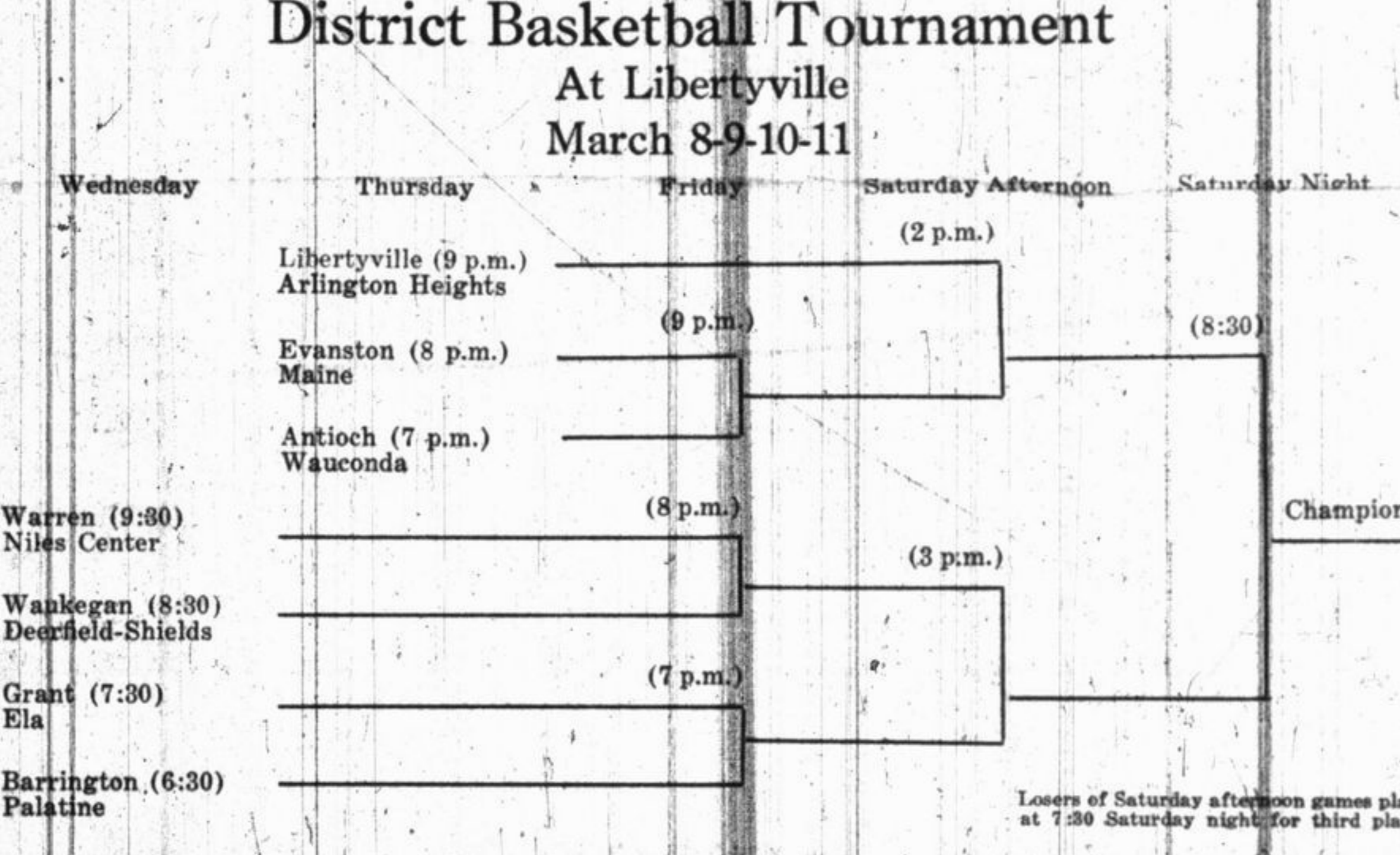
