A RESOLUTION: Dumaresq Spencer Post No. 145 of the American Legion, Department of Illinois, in regular meeting assembled at Highland Park, Illinois, May 18, 1933.

Whereas, An acute emergency exists in Deerfield Township in regard to relief activities, and

Whereas, The relief agencies are greatly strained due to the lack of funds, and

Whereas, The taxpayers of this community are already heavily taxed and demand their funds be intelligently expended, and

Whereas, The Dumaresq Spencer Post No. 145 of the American Legion is vitally interested in the welfare of this community,

Therefore be it resolved, That

the Dumaresq Spencer Post No. 145 of the American Legion strongly recommend to the Highland Park Social Service Committee and other relief agencies located in Deerfield Township that the able-bodied men or women in any family receiving direct aid should be assigned to some form of created work which will benefit the whole community. We are convinced that the able-bodied American citizen takes pride in working for what they receive and do not believe in a dole system. This assignment of created work must not conflict in any way with the work of relief projects as outlined by the Illinois Relief Committee, and

"Be it further Resolved, That we also recommend that all families receiving aid in Deerfield Township accept the offer of, the Highland Park Community Gardens and take a definite part in providing for themselves a liberal amount of food. Taking food out of the ground will not only furnish a great relief this summer but much of it can be preserved for use during the winter and thus lightening the heavy load of the relief agencies and through them on the taxpayer, and

"Be it further Resolved, That we also strongly recommend to the Highland Park Social Service Com-

mittee that they keep a record of those families, who without good reason, refuse to take part in the Community Garden activities, and
