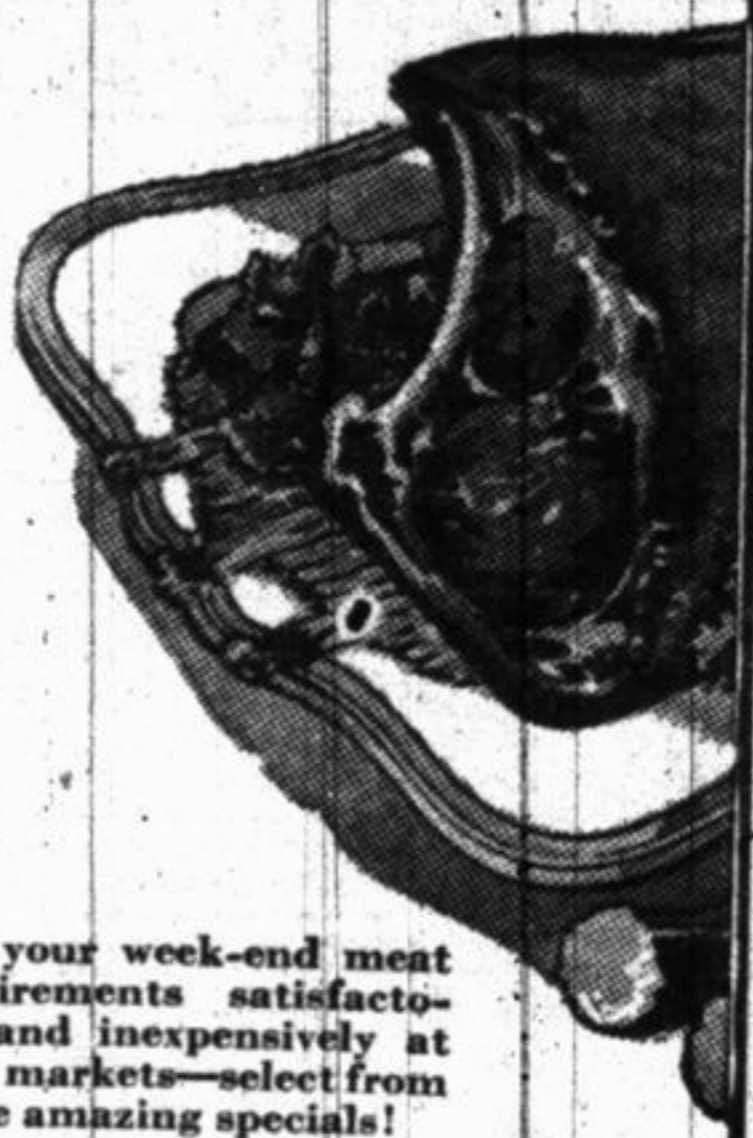

Landscaping Work Is Beautifying Grounds Of Our Public Library

The Highland Park Public Library Board believes that an informal report upon the landscaping work that has been in progress on the library grounds during the past several weeks will be of interest and that some reference to the means through which this has been accomplished is appropriate at this time.

The general problem was that of relating the building as far as possible to its natural setting and of restoring the natural slopes of the ravine which contributes so much to the character of the grounds.

Small trees, chiefly native crab apple and plum, have been grouped about the building to lighten the effect of foundation and stone walls and masses of shrubbery set here and there as the need to harmonize building and natural setting seemed to direct.

The natural woodland effect along the course of the ravine has been strengthened. A pleasing vista thru the woods was established and then walled in by a heavy planting of native shrubbery.

Through the generosity of the Community Garden Class of the Highland Park Woman's Club, Mrs. Ernest Reed, chairman, a unique bird bath of weathered stone taken especially for that purpose from an old stone quarry near Joliet was set up on a natural terrace in the ravine against a background of arbutus and red cedar.

In the landscaping work the Highland Park Garden Study Club, Mrs. Fred Clifton, chairman, has generously cooperated. This club has interested itself in bringing in colonies of native plants that may reasonably be expected to establish themselves in open woodlands.

In landscaping the rear of the library grounds it was soon apparent that the adjoining grounds of the Y.W.C.A. home should be a part of the picture. In this co-operation of the director, Mrs. Lydia Hutton and of Mrs. E. T. R. Murfey, president, and Mrs. J. B. Deibler, house chairman, the landscaping proceeded with regard to property lines.

And now for reference to the way in which our committee on buildings and grounds, of which Mrs. Charles Rubens is chairman, and Mrs. Clarence Balke, and Jesse E. Smith, members, has been able to carry on. It has had the advice of all times of the distinguished landscape architect, Jens Jensen, who has planned and directed all planting. He has made a gift to the public of his valuable services and has been content for his compensation in the satisfaction of helping to create a simple and beautiful setting for the library building.
