In the landscaping work the Highland Park Garden Study Club, Mrs. Fred Clutton, chairman, has generously co-operated. This club has interested itself in bringing in colonies of native plants that may reasonably be expected to establish themselves in open woodlands. A fund was set aside to draw on from time to time as actual expenditure is involved while leaving the members to make individual contributions to the collection of native plants. This work will carry over into the season when plant life i dormant and can safely be moved.

In landscaping the rear of the library grounds it was soon apparent that the adjoining grounds of the YWCA home should be a part of the picture. In this the co-operation of the director, Mrs. Lydia Hutton and of Mrs. E. T. R. Murfey, president, and Mrs. J. B. Deibler, house chairman, was speedily forthcoming, and the landscaping proceeded without regard to property lines. The Y.W.'s contributed choice boulders from their fence which was no longer needed and these were used for shoring up ravine slopes, and the library committee contributed cut stone for a "perfectly grand" outdoor incinerator for the Y.W.C.A. Besides this there was a surplus of cut stone sufficient for an ample "council ring" designed by Jens Jensen and this was built in the south east corner of the Y.W. grounds. The ring was largely screened off with shrubbery to give it privacy and a stone hearth in its center set up to complete the equipment.

And now for reference to the way in which our committee on buildings and grounds, of which Mrs. Charles Rubens is chairman, and Mrs. Clarence Balke, and Jesse L. Smith, members, has been able to carry on. It has had the advice of all times of the distinguished landscape architect, Jens Jensen, who has planned and directed all planting. He has made a gift to the public of his valuable services and has been content for his compensation in the satisfaction of helping to create a simple and beautiful setting for the library building. The Highland Park Social Service Committee early accepted the project as an outlet for unemployment and furnished almost all of the labor involved. The library board had no payroll. It gives one pleasure to report that this work was uniformly done as well as if under a direct wage scale. Our workmen took a personal interest in this public undertaking. Highest praise is due Lawrence Wygal who represented Social Service and superintended the work in an efficient manner. Special mention should be made of Christian Peterson of Deerfield who contributed valuable small trees and shrubs from his na-
