been filled out earlier in the day at their district relief stations where they had been summoned by cards arriving in the morning mail. The men will all take an oath in which, among other things, they agree "to remain in the civilian conservation corps for six months unless sooner released by proper authority," and "to obey those in authority and observe all the rules and regulations thereof."

The recruits will be trained by regular army officers at Fort Sheridan under Major Paul C. McDonnell for a period of two weeks before they are turned over to the forestry department.

By order of Secretary of Labor Perkins, only unmarried young men, from 18 to 25 years of age, whose families already are on the relief rolls, are eligible for the reforestation army. The plan is for each to receive \$5 a month of his \$30 a month salary for himself, the remaining \$25 to be paid to his family by the government. Pay starts with enlistment, and when the recruit gets his first pay the relief allowance received by his family will be reduced proportionately, is the plan.

Martin H. Bickam, director of relief work for the the Cook County division of the Illinois Emergency Relief Commission, predicts that before the end of the month a large number of the Chicago recruits in the reforestation army will be at work in the Skokie valley on dam construction and flood control projects.

It is explained that there will be no public enlistment of recruits for the forest army, but the eligible young men will be secured from the lists of families receiving unemployment relief. Already the 4000 allotted to the Chicago area have been tentatively chosen, and will report at the West Madison Street headquarters at the rate of about 300 a day. As soon as they are enrolled they will be sent to Fort Sheridan for two weeks' physical set-up and training in woodcraft, after which they will be moved to forests, and national parks for work on the president's reconstruction program.

Deerfield Students at High School Are Active in All Affairs

C. E. Bates, principal of the Deerfield Grade School, has been making an extensive research and study of the accomplishments of students from his school, who are now attending Deerfield-Shields High School.

"The Highway," published by eighth grade students, bi-monthly, in its last issue contained the following:

"An opinion was expressed recently that because Deerfield Grammar School had no special provision for music, art, orchestra, band, athletics, etc., that her pupils attending high school were not qualified and did not care to enter this type of activities in the high school. An investigation of this criticism showed the following facts:

"Of the 1320 pupils enrolled in high school Deerfield Grammar

School has 110 or 8.34 percent. "Of the 1320 pupils enrolled in high school, 665 take part in activities outside of regular school work. This is 51.13 percent of the pupils enrolled.

"Of the 110 pupils in high school from Deerfield Grammar School, 66 or 60.45 percent take part in these extra curricular activities.

"This means that pupils from Deerfield Grammar School take more of an interest in outside activities than does the student body as a whole. Stated another way, Deerfield Grammar School has 9.12 percent more pupils taking part in extra curricular activities than she normally deserves.

"One of the high school instructors mentioned the fact that there would no doubt be more Deerfield pupils in these activities but many felt they had to catch the bus and could not remain after school.

"Deerfield Grammar School is proud of her students in high school."
