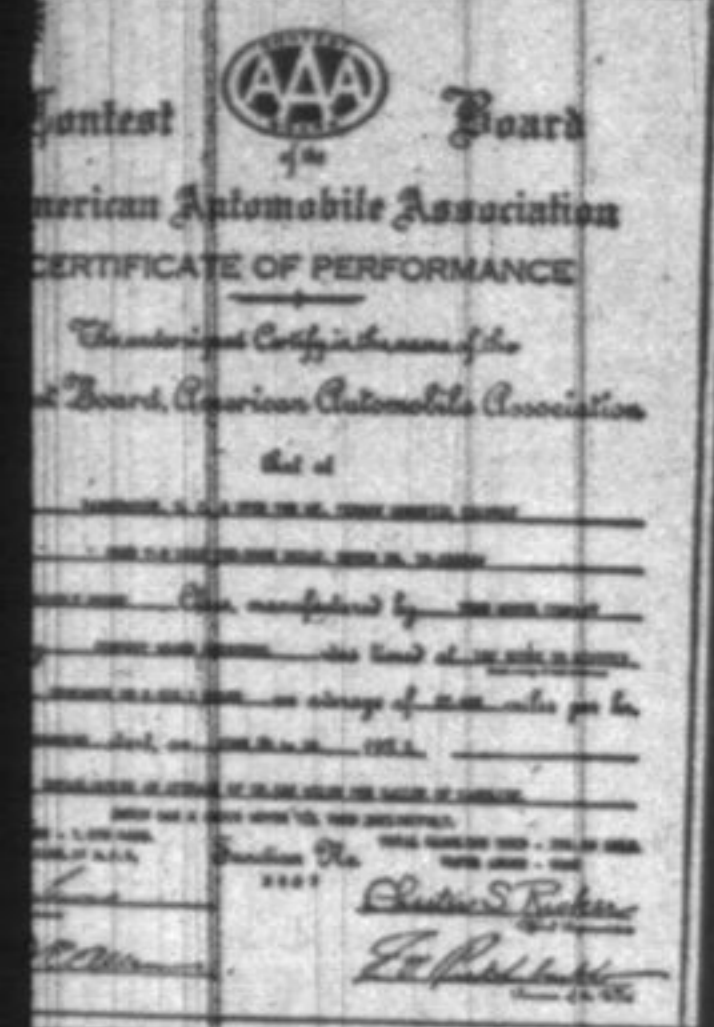


Economy Run

The economy run was entirely in charge of Contest Board personnel and was made with a strictly stock Ford car. Sent on its way by United States Senator R. R. Reynolds, of North Carolina, the crew operated the car day and night for more than seven days, both on Washington streets and the superb motor highway which connects the Capitol with Mount Vernon, the colonial home of George Washington on the bank of the Potomac river.

Functioned Perfectly
During the entire run the Ford functioned perfectly. No mechanical adjustments were required. The crankcase was filled with new oil after every 1,000 miles, but no additional oil was required. After the initial filling at the start of the run no additional water was required in the radiator.

The Board's certificate shows that the run was made at an average speed of 27.468 miles per hour. The speed was less in city streets and greater along the Mt. Vernon Highway.

Annapolis Vacancy Is Announced in District

"Inasmuch as the Navy Department has informed me of a vacancy which will exist early next year at Annapolis to be filled from my district, I have asked Capt. Edward A. Evers, U.S.N.R.F., to act as president of an examining board to consist of naval officers to hold an examination probably the latter part of September or early in October, and select the candidate best fitted physically and mentally for the appointment. The applicant should be not less than sixteen years of age nor more than twenty years of age on April 1 of the calendar year in which he enters the Naval Academy, and must have resided in my district for not less than two years," says James Simpson, Jr., congressman from the Tenth District.

"I shall accept the board's recommendation and qualify their choice as my appointee. Those desiring to compete may file their application at my office, 1791 Howard Street, Chicago.

"I am making this announcement at an early date in order to allow the boys competing ample time to

prepare themselves for the examination.

"I am also writing to Phil Collins, executive vice-president of American Legion "33" Corporation, asking whether or not he can arrange in some way to honor the successful candidate during the National Convention of the American Legion to be held here during October. It is my thought that perhaps the boy chosen could be given a ticket to the Convention, and possibly be congratulated by the National Commander. I feel that this is consistent, inasmuch as it will be the forming of the career for the successful youth, and naturally feel that it would be an honor for him to be recognized by the leaders of the prevalent organization of ex-soldiers, sailors and marines."

Highland Park Public Library
Do you use the Highland Park Public Library? Reading rooms are free to all. Books may be borrowed, free of charge, by any one who lives, works, attends school, or pays in the city. Others living outside the city may obtain a card by paying an annual fee of \$2.00. A library card is needed when books are wanted for home reading.

It is well to carry your library card with you all the time. Otherwise you may find just the book you want some time when you haven't your card. If you do not find on the library shelf the book you are looking for, ask your librarian about it. Ask also about the postal card order you may leave for the book you want.

Each library has a list on cards of all its books which is called the Public Catalog. You are free to use the catalog yourself. The library has books to read, books to study, and books to furnish information quickly. Use your library. Own a library card.

Reading with a Purpose
One tenth of the population of the United States is of Negro descent, Dr. Alain Locke points out in a reading course, "The Negro in America," published by the American Library Association and just received at the Highland Park Public Library.

Dr. Locke, himself a distinguished Negro, covers in a bold sweeping stride the problems which confronted his race under slavery, the problems presented by the reconstruction, and the "problem" today.
