**Things to Cook**

 There is nothing like the good old fashioned German Coffee Cake to top off the Sunday morning breakfast. It can be prepared the day before and still be served with delicious freshness the following morning.

**Delicious German Coffee Cake**  
 6 tablespoons sugar  
 1 1/2 cups pastry flour  
 2 teaspoons baking powder  
 1/2 teaspoon salt  
 1/4 teaspoons nutmeg  
 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon  
 2 tablespoons shortening  
 1 egg  
 1/2 cup milk or water.

**Topping**  
 2 tablespoons flour  
 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon  
 Few grains salt  
 1/2 cup brown sugar  
 2 tablespoons butter  
 1/4 cup walnuts (chopped).

Sift dry ingredients; cut in shortening. Add unbeaten egg and milk or water; with spoon on bottom of bowl, stir round and round until well mixed. Turn into paper lined pan.

Add flour, cinnamon and salt to

brown sugar. Cut in butter with fork. Spread over cake. Sprinkle with chopped nuts. Bake in a hot oven (375 degrees) 25 to 30 minutes.

Currants are now ripe, and nothing is more delicious than a properly baked currant pie.

You will find that a meringue topping adds to its appearance and makes it more inviting.

**Currant Meringue Pie**  
 2 tablespoons flour  
 1 cup sugar  
 2 egg yolks  
 1 cup mashed fresh currants.

**Meringue**  
 2 egg whites  
 1/4 teaspoon baking powder  
 4 tablespoons sugar.

Sift flour and sugar; add to slightly beaten egg yolks; mix with currants. Turn into pie plate lined with crust. Bake in a moderate oven (350) degrees for 45 minutes. When cool cover with meringue. Place in a slow oven (300 degrees) for 20 minutes to brown meringue.

**Meringue**  
 Beat egg whites until frothy, add baking powder and continue beating until stiff and creamy. Fold in sugar.
