Romantic Rebel
One of the books on the Treasure Hunt lists will be equally enjoyed by adults. Hildegarde Hawthorne's book, "Romantic Rebel," is a story-biography of her famous grandfather, Nathaniel Hawthorne. In these pages are intimate pictures of the boy Nathaniel, who disliked the dull routine of school in Salem, yet already knew he wanted to write, as he printed a newspaper by hand on note-paper at Bowdoin College and back in Salem, he spent five long years struggling to perfect himself in his chosen work. Success was long in coming, but on the publication of "The Scarlet Letter" it arrived with startling thoroughness. Hawthorne, his wife, Sophia Peabody, and children left Salem forever, to live most happily in a little red house just outside Lenox. Here the reader sees Hawthorne working in his garden in summer, steering the bob-sled down the long hill in winter, skating on the pond with his children or reading before the fire in the evening to his family that which he had written that day. Oliver Wendell Holmes and Herman Melville were among the distinguished friends who sometimes joined the family circle.

When Franklin Pierce became president, Hawthorne accepted appointment to the consulship of Liverpool. Not for seven years did the family return home. There were adventures and a near tragedy in Italy, friendship with the Brownings, Tennyson, and the two sons of Robert Burns. The author says of Hawthorne, "His life was a gentle and a generous one, and he possessed besides the giving of his art, the even rarer genius of making those he loved and who loved him, happy."

North Shore Line To Make Reductions In Commutation Tickets

Large savings will be afforded commuters by the Chicago North Shore and Milwaukee Railroad, starting Sept. 1, when drastic reductions will be made in the cost of 6-ride monthly individual commutation tickets, it was announced by R. S. Amis, passenger traffic manager. The new rates will be effective between Chicago and all points served by the North Shore Line north to Kenosha, Wis.

Coincident with inauguration of these new low commutation rates, the North Shore Line will introduce a new style of commutation ticket designed to increase the convenience to regular riders. This will be a "punch card" ticket, consisting of a single piece of cardboard from which the trainman will punch a number each time it is presented until the ticket has been used up. It will replace the coupon style ticket now used in all commutation rates.

"The new low rates for the 60-ride individual tickets will reduce travel costs considerably for persons making daily trips between the north shore communities and Chicago," said Mr. Amis. "Regular

commuters will be practicing good economy by leaving their cars at home or parking them at the nearest North Shore Line station and traveling to and from Chicago by train. The new style commutation ticket should prove popular with regular riders, being much more compact and more easily handled than the coupon ticket."

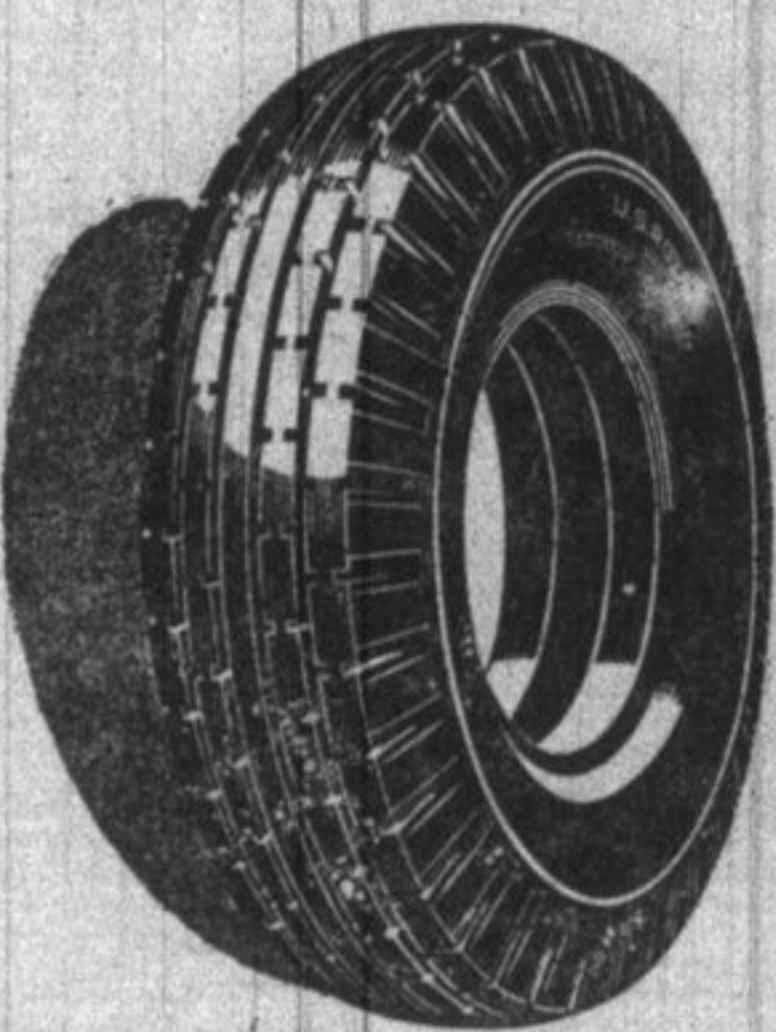
