A marked increase in patients has been noticed by those in charge of the center since it has moved to a more central location at 845 Chicago Avenue, corner of Main Street. A woman physician is in attendance every Tuesday between 1 and 3 p.m.

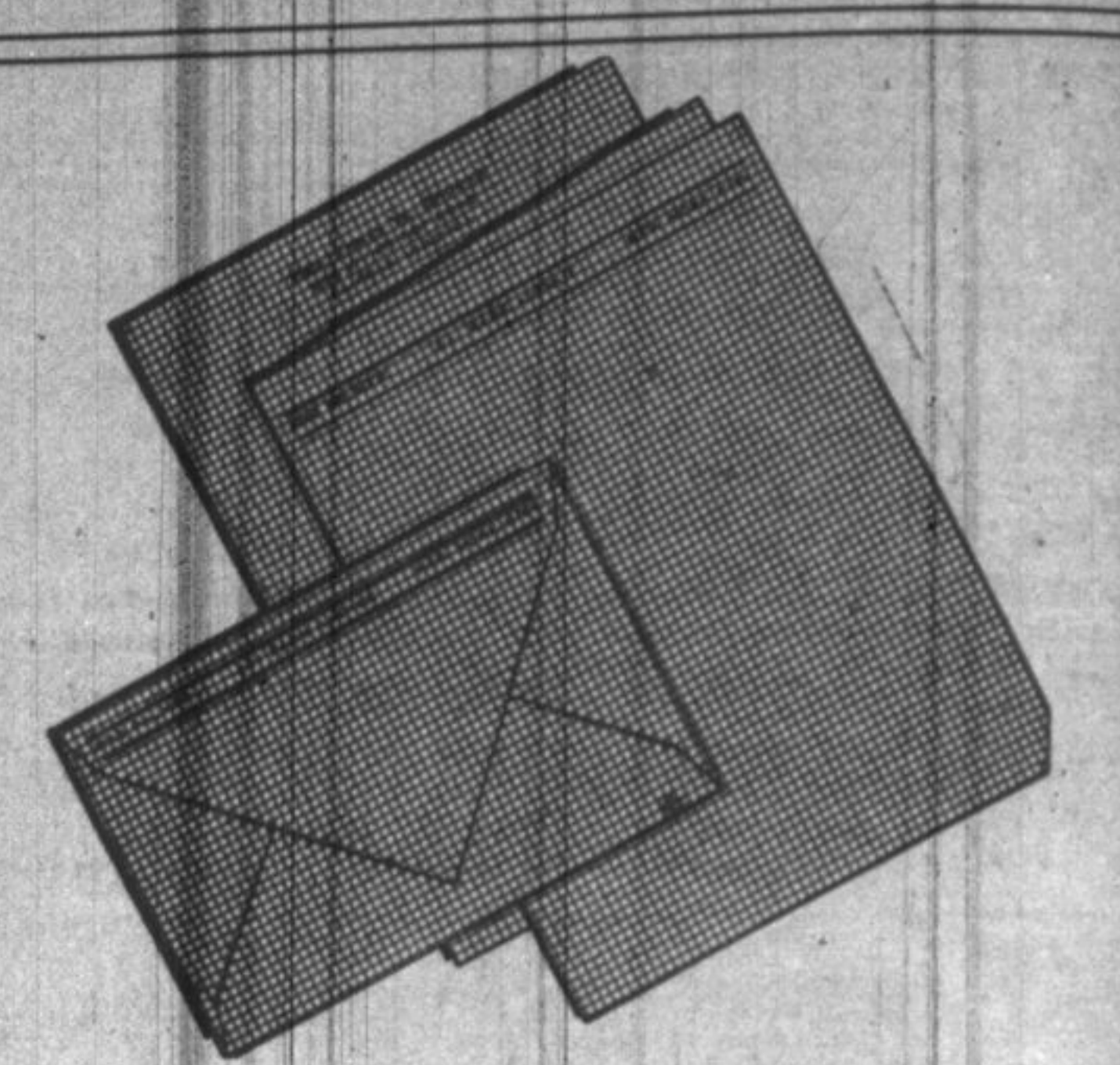

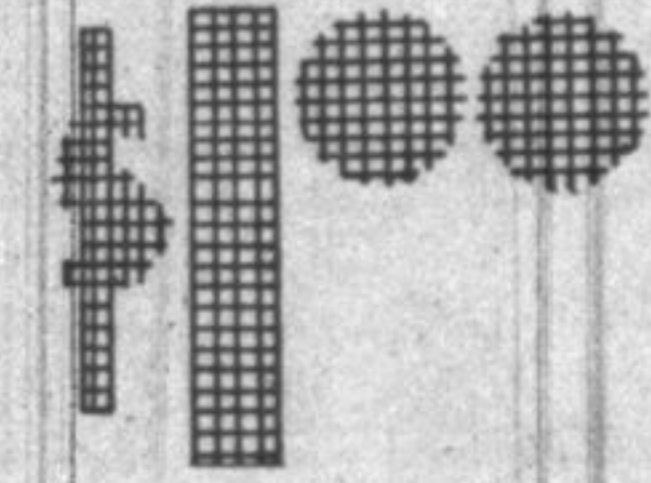
