Educational Prog

Mayor Emil B. Metz, of Highland Park, is general chairman of a committee organized to carry out all commercial enterprises under the blanket code of the National Recovery Act, up all local consumers under the act.

Mayor Metz, in his committee, which began its educational campaign, says he will see to it that the entire town will be under the blanket code, the time limit set by President Franklin D. Roosevelt, and the adoption of the code.

Out of a possible 25 have already signed the code. It is the aim of the committee to "sell" the code here, and to see that it live up to its provisions.

Although no effort has been made yet, it is expected that there has been an employment in Highland Park because of the signing of the code.

Mayor Metz, in a concern displayed by the NRA, it is the aim of the committee to see that the code is enforced by an individual trade firm which is a part of the code, is preparing any of the code, the local trade with that firm.
