### Sports and Exhibits at a Century of Progress

(This is the third and last of a series of three articles on the making of the Chevrolet car in the General Motors Building, at a Century of Progress.)

At Station No. 19 we see Fisher craftsmen mounting the motor on the chassis. This is one of the most interesting steps of the entire assembly line. Chevrolet craftsmen take the engine, which has been made ready in the previous operation, and carry it over to the chassis by means of a hoist, then gradually lower it into its proper place in the frame. After that, the propeller shaft is inserted, and as the motor is rocked back and forth, the shaft is gradually forced inside the universal joint. Then, after every thing is in the right position, the engine is lowered onto its cushion balanced mounting, and bolted into place.

Scene No. 20 consists of another interesting "side" operation, in which the various parts of Chevrolet's steering mechanism is put together. The steering wheel, the steering column and cover, and the steering gear unit are assembled, apart from the main assembly line, then anchored to the chassis. Following that the motor pans are added, the brake pedals are connected up, the battery is mounted, brakes adjusted, and muffler and tail pipe installed.

Now we turn to a familiar operation, mounting tires on wheels and attaching the wheels to the car. This is done at Post No. 21. Meanwhile notice at the side how the running boards are being assembled together with the front and rear fenders. Notice also, how these parts are then added to the chassis. Now, we are about ready for the body. At the end of the Fisher line workmen

are installing electric wiring in the body, adding the instrument panel, putting in lights and switches.

Of all the steps taken so far, the next is unquestionably the most dramatic. The body is picked up from the Fisher line by a hoist suspended from arched supports, and swung slowly through the air to the Chevrolet line. There it is slowly, carefully brought into position over the chassis and lowered. One workman on each side lines up the points where the body bolts are inserted. Then all is ready. Down goes the body on its supporting brackets. The jaws of the crane are released. The body and chassis are now one unit! And men get busy tightening the bolts.

At Post No. 23, the radiator core shell and grill are assembled, off to one side, into onesingle unit, ready for the main assembly. Hinges and hood catches are also put in place on the hood. Then, in the "final car assembly," all the finishing touches are added. Electric wiring is hooked up. So are the various engine controls. Toe boards are screwed into place. Bumpers, hubcaps, and headlights are installed. Finally, the radiator and hood are mounted in front.

Water is put into the radiator, and fuel into the gasoline tank. Then using a long rubber hose, a workman sprays steam into the interior of the car to raise the nap of the upholstery and bring out its sheen. After that, the engine is started for the first time and the car receives an exhaustive "check-over" by the final inspectors. It is their responsibility to see to it that every one of the operations has been done perfectly—that the car itself is ready to give the kind of dependable service which the world has learned to expect from a Chevrolet.

### Tax Exemption For Homes Is Program Of National Organization

S. H. Hanson, of Waukegan, is president of a newly-formed organization called the National Taxpayers' League, which is expanding into a nation-wide organization. The primary program of the league is the exemption of homes from taxation, and petitions which will be sent to Governor Henry Horner of Illinois, proposing an amendment to the state constitution along this line, are being circulated in Lake County and other counties in the state.

Other officers of this new organization are as follows: Vice-president, W. C. Lindgren, of North Chicago; secretary, Willis A. Overholser, of Libertyville; treasurer, A. Johnson, of Libertyville; and publicity chairman, Dr. Thomas A. Carter.

The National Taxpayers' League explains its aims as follows:

"Inasmuch as we now have a state sales tax, beer revenues, and will soon have liquor revenues, this is the time to reduce property taxes and particularly the tax on homes. "Having this in mind; the Lower House of the Illinois Legislature passed a Bill on June 27, 1933, which provided that the home owner should become exempt from taxation on the first One Thousand Dollars valuation, and to limit all property taxes to 1 per cent of property value.

"This Bill passed the Lower House with a majority of about 20 to 1, but the Session was adjourned before the Senate had a chance to vote on it.

"In Illinois, a constitutional amendment is necessary before this kind of legislation can become a

law, and a constitutional amendment must be voted upon by a state-wide referendum at a regular election.

"The next regular Session of the Illinois Legislature is in 1933, thus in order that a proposal for a Constitutional Amendment may appear on the Ballot in the fall election of 1934, it will be necessary to hold a Special Session.

"A reduction of property taxes, together with some exemption from taxation for the home owner, is absolutely necessary for the following reasons.

"It will help to thaw out the Frozen Assets, such as mortgages, special improvement bonds and many other securities, and thus make it possible for mortgage companies, banks and many individuals to resume business on a normal basis.

"It will help to revive the Building Industry, but thousands of people to work and thus to a large extent put an end to unemployment.

"The State of Texas, passed a law in the fall of 1932 exempting the home owner from taxation on the first Three Thousand Dollars of valuation; and the State of Florida passed a law in the early part of 1933 exempting the home owner from taxation on the first Five Thousand Dollars of valuation.

"In support of the Bill passed by the Illinois House of Representatives on June 2, The National Taxpayers League, an Illinois Corporation, Incorporated 'not for profit,' with headquarters in Waukegan, is now circulating Petitions in Lake County asking the Governor to call a Special Session."
