craftsmen mounting the motor on the chassis. This is one of the most interesting steps of the entire assembly line. Chevrolet craftsmen take the engine, which has been made ready in the previous operation, and carry it over to the chasis by means of a hoist, then gradually lower it into its proper place in the frame. After that, the propeller shaft is inserted, and as the motor is rocked back and forth, the shaft is gradually forced inside the universal joint. Then, after every thing is in the right position, the engine is lowered onto its cushion balanced mounting, and bolted into

Scene No. 20 consists of another interesting "side" operation, in which the various parts of Chevrolet's steering mechanism is put together. The steering wheel, the steering column and cover, and the steering gear unit are assembled, apart from the main assembly line, then anchored to the chassis. Following that the motor pans are added, the brake pedals are connected up, the battery is mounted, brakes adjusted, and muffler and tail pipe

Now we turn to a familiar operation, mounting tires on wheels and attaching the wheels to the car This is done at Post No. 21. Meanwhile notice at the side how the running boards are being assembled together with the front and rear fenders. Notice also, how these parts are then added to the chassis. Now, we are about ready for the body. At the end of the Fisher line workmen

Of all the steps taken so far, the next is unquestionably the most dramatic. 
