**West Point, Annapolis**  
**Exams Will Be Sept. 27**

Congressman James Simpson, Jr., recently announced through the press that he had been advised by the War Department and the Navy Department of the United States government of vacancies existing in his district, one at the United States Military Academy at West Point, and one at the United States Naval Academy at Annapolis, and that in accordance with his policy he would fill each vacancy through competitive examinations.

The examining boards will be comprised respectively of army and navy officers, and the boy passing first in the physical, oral and written examinations, will be recommended by the boards to him for appointment.

Congressman Simpson now advises that the examinations will start on Wednesday, Sept. 27, and further states that any of his constituents who meet the requirements of either of the two academies, and wish to apply who have not already done so, may do so up until Monday, Sept. 25, by appearing in person at his office, 1791 Howard Street, Chicago, and furnishing an affidavit indicating residence of not less than two years in his, the Tenth Congressional District.

Targets towed by airplanes were illuminated by six huge searchlights as three-inch anti-aircraft guns blazed out over the lake at the "enemy" ships. The guns used from the ground have a range of eight miles.
