Children's Theater Is Started In Highland Park by the Y.W.C.A.

At a meeting of the board of directors of the Highland Park YWCA Tuesday, it was decided to start a children's theatre movement as part of the educational program for the coming year.

"It is a vast undertaking and one which will need both time and effort for successful organization. The need for such a project has long been felt in this community," says a director. "An authority on child drama says of the movement: 'Dramatic work employs the whole of a child's power. It chases out self-consciousness, relieves formality, enriches experience, organizes imagination and aids in character development. In fact dramatization is of supreme value in the study of literature and points the way to the achievement of highest personal values and development of a sympathetic philosophy of life.'"

Miss Catherine Marie Geary, who handled dramatic activities at the "Y" the past year, outlined the program of organization. Miss Geary holds a degree in drama from the Chicago Musical College, is a member of Phi Mu Gamma, national allied arts fraternity, and has made a particular study of children's theatres, having done considerable research work in that field. She will start immediate work on the project together with a committee of ten local women.

There are to be several workshop groups open to children of grade and high school age for a very nominal fee each month. The groups are scheduled to meet at the YWCA weekly with Miss Geary, and every child, besides taking an active part in their own group programs, will have an equal opportunity to take part in the casting for the theatre groups according to individual progress.

These groups, however, will be so limited in number that those registering are urged to do so this week. Further information may be obtained by calling the YWCA, Highland Park 675.
