This announcement is not only important to candidates for scouting, but for scoutmasters as well.

LOTS OF SCOUTS THIS YEAR

From close observation in every district of the Area, more boys want to come into the ranks of scouts than a year ago. There are many troops in the council that have great numbers of boys knocking at their door for admittance. Fortunately the leadership personnel of these troops is of such high calibre as to justify the entrance to the troop of a great number of boys at this time.

LOTS OF ENTHUSIASM FOR WINTER PROGRAM

Word comes from council headquarters that almost every troop is enthusiastic about the fall and winter program. Usually there is a fair percentage of troops that have the idea of a winter program, but this year it is different.
