The Pullman Panthers, another powerful aggregation of Hoosiers, hailing from the vicinity of Hammond and the far south side, boast of many ex-college stars who are accustomed to playing stellar football. Some of the luminaries on the Panther team who will be seen in action next Sunday include the famous Chuck Bennett and Kekiah of Indiana University, Gallivan of Illinois, Harriman of Purdue and Gross, captain of the Chattanooga College eleven last year.

Chuck Bennett, former all-conference pick, was the only person last year to score against the Chicago Shamrocks on a 9-yard run.
