Mrs. E. H. Selig entertained her sewing club last Wednesday afternoon.

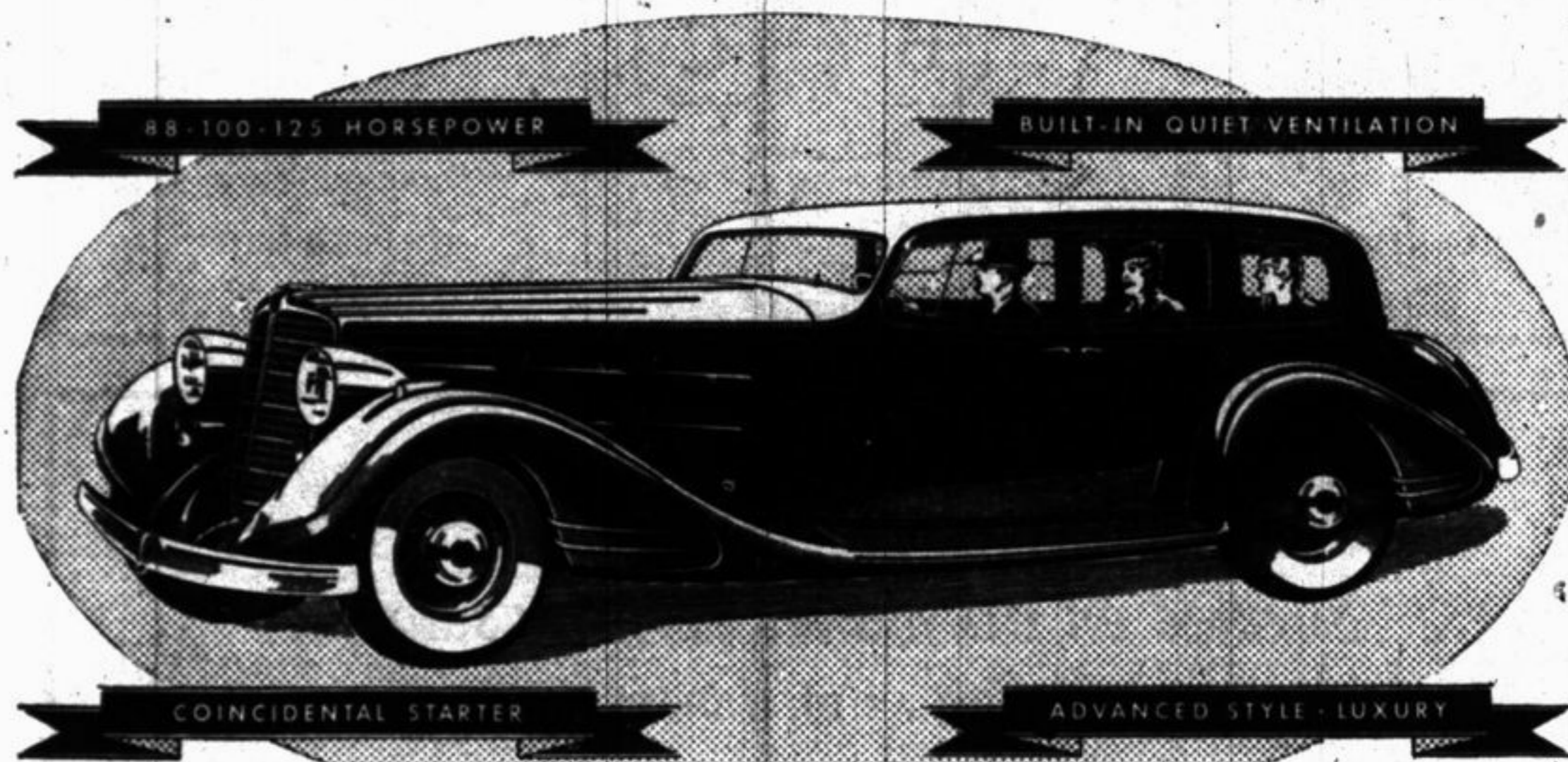
Mr. and Mrs. W. Gleske have moved from Waukegan to the Milton Frantz apartment.
