**Cubism and Futurism Discussed at Ravinia by Mrs. George Kuh**

At the Ravinia Woman's Club meeting on Nov. 8, Mrs. George Kuh of Highland Park spoke on "Cubism and Futurism," a subject which she seemed well-qualified to handle. Her talk was splendidly organized and interestingly presented in terms the layman understands, so that the club members who attended obtained a definite conception of this much misunderstood trend in art.

Apparently the French impressionists of the late 19th century made the first break from a factual subject to abstract painting. Cubism was experimented with between 1910-20 and was defined by Mrs. Kuh as the "combined presentation of a given object as seen from several aspects." Futurism (which lasted only a couple of years 1910-12) aimed to "present successive events simultaneously, thus representing motion rather than subject." A reaction has already set in, indicating that art, like history, goes in cycles.

At the meeting an announcement was made regarding the bridge party to be held at 2:30 p.m. Wednesday, Dec. 6, at the Village House. The Woman's Club and the Ravinia P.-T. A., with their respective chairmen, Mrs. Lee Frank and Mrs. Harold Wampler, are jointly sponsoring this function, the proceeds of which are to apply on the grand piano. **North Shore Line to Reduce Fares 44 Per Cent Effective Dec. 1**

Fares of the Chicago North Shore and Milwaukee Railroad will be cut from 3.6 to 2 cents a mile—more than 44 per cent—in all service between all points on the North Shore Line, effective Dec. 1. At the same time the two-day round-trip excursion fares from suburban communities to downtown Chicago will be reduced more than 10 per cent.

"The North Shore Line is slashing its fares in the hope that this will stimulate business and induce people to 'go places' again," said R. S. Amis, passenger traffic manager. "The new fare of 2 cents a mile is far below the cost of operating an automobile. This reduction is an experiment, and its success depends upon whether the volume of riding increases to the point that it offsets the lower unit of revenues."
