**Safety Gates Installed By North Shore Line**  
Installation of automatic electric safety gates has been completed by the North Shore Line at three additional grade crossings on the Skokie Valley Route, and work has been started on placing these modern protective devices at three other intersections on the Shore Line Route, it was announced today by Frank J. Kramer, engineer in charge of maintenance of way.  
The gates which have just been put in operation on the Skokie Valley Route are at Dempster Street, Niles Center; Glenview Road and Dundee Road. Those on which installation work has been started are at Stanley Avenue, North Chicago, and at Westminster and Deerpath Avenue in Lake Forest.  
Automatic electric gates are now in operation at 45 grade crossings on the North Shore Line, which has employed this type of protective device more extensively than any other railway in the world. These include 21 gates on the Skokie Valley Route from Howard Street, Chicago, to Mundelein; and 24 on the Shore Line Route between Linden Avenue, Wilmette, and Milwaukee.

The new gates are electrically operated and equipped with both bell and flasher light signals, giving triple protection for both motorists and pedestrians. The barrier arms are constructed so that, if struck by an automobile when lowered, they will swing to one side with the impact and then return to their proper position across the road.

**County Conference In Libertyville Dec. 1**  
Under the direction of the Lake County Council of Religious Education, a county-wide conference of young people and their teachers and leaders is announced by Rev. Merrill E. Tope, of Fox Lake, who is the Young People's division superintendent for the Council of Religious Education. This meeting will be held at the Libertyville Methodist Church, Friday evening, Dec. 1, beginning at 7:30 p.m.  
Members of young people's departments and Sunday school classes from practically all of the Protestant churches are invited to participate. The program calls for two separate group conferences, one for young people from 12 to 24 years of age, under the leadership of Rev. Ellis Cowling, of Gurnee, and the other group made up of the adult teachers of young people in the Sunday School, to discuss materials and methods of working with young people in the church. The two groups will meet in a combined assembly for the last session of the conference. To discuss problems of vital importance in the work with young people.

This is the first effort that has been made to bring together the young people of the county for the discussion of problems and exchange of ideas, and if it meets with success, the meeting will be followed by district conferences and institutes.
