Maj. C. K. Rhinehart To Talk At Reserve Officers Association

Major C. K. Rhinehart of Highland Park will speak before the Lake County Chapter of the Reserve Officers Association Thursday night at 8 o'clock in the Lake View Room of the Waukegan Hotel.

Major Rhinehart enlisted in the cavalry in 1906 and transferred to the aviation corps in 1915. He was a member of the American Expeditionary Forces during the World War and became one of the first air aces of the United States. He took part in many air-raids and has a colorful career in aviation circles.

A plane crash in October, 1921, at Austin, Tex., resulted in two years and eight months hospitalization for skull and numerous other fractures and internal injuries. He

has since transferred from U. S. Army Aviation Corps to the Field Artillery.

He blazed many airway trails in all sections of the United States immediately after the war, many of which are now accepted transcontinental airways.

At the present time Major Rhinehart is a famous polo player and a member of the Fort Sheridan polo team.
