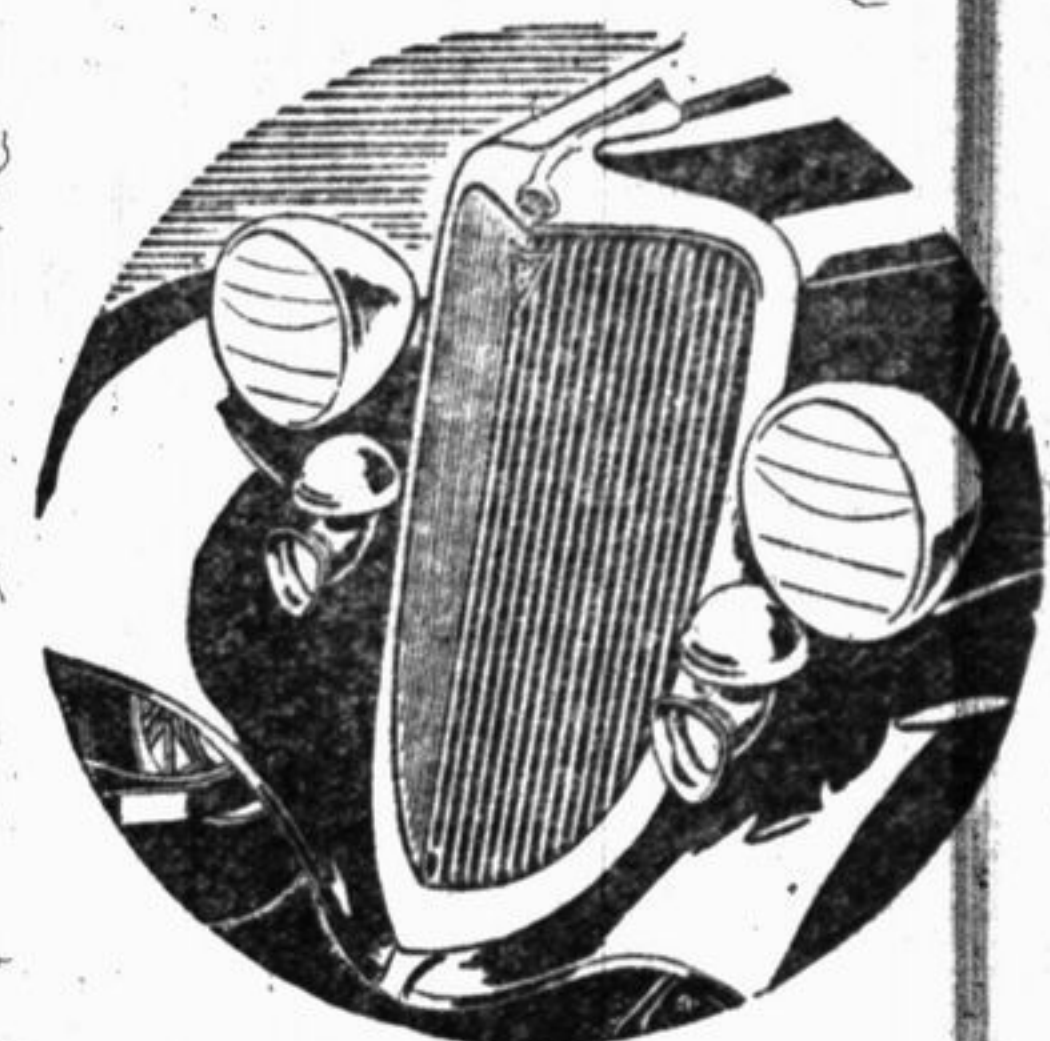
Miss Roberta Burgess To Speak On Russia
