Rebecca Lobb was born July 31, 1859 at Hastings, Ontario, Canada, the daughter of John and Mary Lobb. In 1881 she was married to Edward Moon of Port Perry, Canada, where they lived for several years. The family moved to Highland Park, Ill., and later to Fenton, Mich.

She leaves her husband and six children: Mrs. Wm. F. Stanton of Lake Geneva, Wis.; Fred R. Moon of Highland Park, J. Herbert Moon of Eyanston, Mrs. E. Roger Fritsch of Ames, Iowa, Murray G. Moon of Carlsbad, Mich., and Messie H. Moon of Fenton, also ten grandchildren, three sisters and two brothers.

Electrolux Research to Be in Evansville

All future scientific research work and testing of the new air cooled Electrolux gas refrigerators will be carried on at the company's plant in Evansville, Ind., the laboratories having been recently removed from New York City to Evansville, it is announced by the North Shore Gas Company, Electrolux distributors in this district.

"The 1934 development program, already under way, necessitated concentration of scientific research inasmuch as it is expected the new air cooled models," according to the announcement.

"Increased sales during 1933 and the encouraging outlook for 1934 pointed to the need for bringing out a constantly widening research program closer to plant and distribution centers."

Research work on Electrolux is carried on under the direction of Dr. William B. Hainsworth, one of the leading authorities on refrigeration in this country, who won the 1933 Charles A. Munroe Award granted annually by the American Gas Association for outstanding achievement in the gas industry. The award this year was granted to Dr. Hainsworth in recognition of his services in perfecting the Air Cooled principle now embodied in Electrolux models. Dr. Hainsworth has a staff of thirty research engineers and technical experts at the Evansville laboratories.
