The Legion Writes A Letter

Mayor E. B. Metzler, Highland Park, Illinois.
Dear Mayor Metzler:
Whereas, The Park Avenue-Egrandale Road project is conceded to be a necessary improvement to the city, opening up as it were, to the people of Highland Park, the only access to the beach in the vicinity of Central Avenue, permitting traffic to go down to Park Avenue and return Egrandale Road, and
Whereas, This project, although approved and authorized to go forward by the authorized officials, it is being held in abeyance by mere protest of adjacent property owners, whose motive is probably to preserve the exclusiveness of their private estates, and
Whereas For reasons unbeknown it has been most difficult to obtain official approval for like projects in the vicinity of Highland Park, and on account of which this vicinity has not enjoyed its proportionate share of the benefits made possible by the recovery program and as the result there are many deserving unemployed.
The Dumaresq Spencer Post of the American Legion passed a resolution called for the job to go forward, and that it lend whatever assistance to the administration necessary to bring this about.
We, therefore, hereby offer you our support, moral and otherwise, in overcoming any resistance that has been met, and we await the opportunity to be of assistance.
It is gratifying that the Park Avenue feature of the project is going forward as far as possible, but it is discouraging and most disappointing that this needed improvement is being lost to the citizens to say nothing of the unemployed, merely because of a whim of selfish interest.
