This talk was given before the lecture and study group of the adult education classes of Lincoln School.

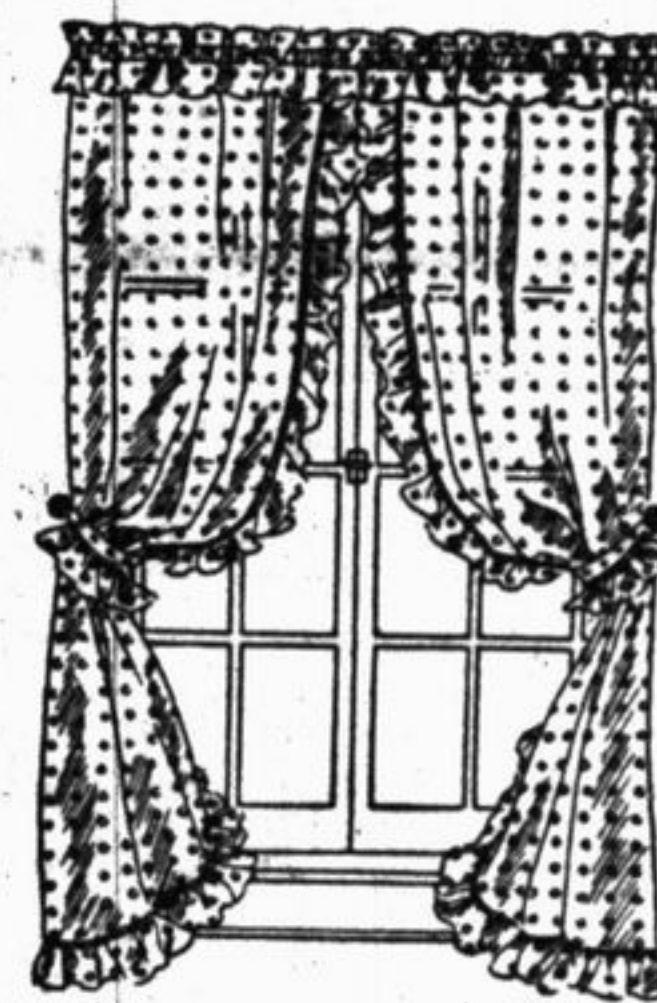
