### Dr. Otto Speaks at Lincoln School Here

The speaker for the lecture and study group of the Adult Education French, 10 a.m. classes at Lincoln School last night was Dr. Henry J. Otto of Northwestern University. Dr. Otto explained the progressive movement in education as an effort to suit education to the qualifications of each individual child.

Certain experiments show that it is better for the child to stay with others of his age, though failing to accomplish the necessary grades. Here, the children who were promoted gained more in knowledge at the end of the semester than those who were not promoted, though the studies given were simpler than those occupying the rest of the class, according to Dr. Otto. The failure of some parents to understand the problem, their interference in some cases, has often hindered progress, he said. Co-operation between home, community and school is essential.
