Highland Park Girl Scouting during the past year had not been spectacular, but has shown a definite and steady growth simple way. Troops progressed regularly, and foundation of good scouting. There are in the village, six troops and one pack. Two of these troops are far too large and should be divided. cause there is a lack of meeting places. Two troops meet at Lincoln School, two at Braeside School, one at the Presbyterian Church, and Trinity Church. A second pack was disbanded because no meeting place could be found for the children. Eight well trained leaders work with these groups. Meeting in the various groups are about 200 girls.

During the past year, from January 1933 to January 1934, there have been seven training courses available to the leaders. Six under the direction of the council director, Miss Grobben, and one with Miss Kay Frances from national headquarters. Each month there has been a meeting of Brownie leaders, and one of Scout leaders for the discussion of troop problems and the exchange of ideas.

The council, a group of women from Highland Park, Glencoe and Winnetka, sponsors the program for the entire area. A local committee headed by Mrs. B. K. Goodman takes charge of the local work.

The Brownie program is for the little girls from seven to ten years of age. Group games are played, fairy tales told and dramatized, simple household duties taught and practiced, handicraft articles and gifts made, the birds, trees and flowers in the vicinity studied and a sense of honor and good sportsmanship learned. The Brownie program turns chores into fun and excess energy into useful channels. It helps the child adjust herself to a group through work and play.

The Girl Scout program aims to give high standards of conduct, right standards of living, cultural hobbies that may lead to vocations, pleasant comradeship, and a sense of community responsibility. This is accomplished through play and
